Reception

Communication and Language

We will continue to develop communication and language skills through our daily classroom routines and daily activities. Children will have lots of opportunities to talk during carpet time, group tasks, playing, and general discussions. We will introduce lots of learning songs and rhymes which we will build up across the year. Children playing in the indoor and outdoor provision every day adults will use this opportunity to encourage and develop Communication and Language skills. All children will be assessed for their Communication and Language skills and we will develop small adult led groups for children who may need some additional support.

Physical Development

Gross Motor Skills: This term children will have their formal PE lesson on a Friday. They should come to school wearing their PE kit every Friday. This half term their PE lessons will focus on Fine motor skills.**Vocabulary we will use**: run, stop, skill

Fine Motor Skills: Children will work on developing their fine motor skills ready for writing and forming recognisable letters. Letter formation rhymes are on the Google Classroom for your information. They will have access to a range of tools and equipment such as pens, scissors, balls, rackets, cones to use in the indoor and outdoor area.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

In PSHE children will be learning about Me and My relationships: They will have the following adult led lessons: Me and my special people; Who can help me?; Our Feelings; Feelings & Bodies; Our Special People balloons; Bullying or teasing? Vocabulary we will use: Friends, family, brother, sister, feelings,

Literacy

Comprehension: Children will read with an adult in small groups on a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. They will bring home the book they have been reading in school every Wednesday. To start with children will have books without words. This is to help develop their comprehension and ability to talk about books. We have a puppet called Grandma Fantastic, she is VERY old (even older than Miss Akrigg!) and she knows soo many words. She will introduce new vocabulary related to our texts.

Word reading: We will start learning phonics in week Three. There will be a phonic information session for parents and carers. This half term we will learn the following graphemes, in the order as follows: s, a, t, p, i, n, g, o, c, c, ck, e, u, r, h, b, f, l. We will learn the following tricky words: is, I, the. On a Wednesday children will receive a sheet outlining the work they will be doing in phonics the following week. Please find this in your child's learning pack and work through this together.

Writing: Our writing this half term will be based on the book: The Bear Hunt. Children will write daily in their phonic lesson.. They will also complete two English activities weekly when they will work with an adult to compose sentences. Vocabulary we will use: sentences, words, vocabulary.

Maths

This half term children will be working on routines, comparing measures, verbally counting including when singing rhymes. Vocabulary we will use: Happen, now, next, after that, smaller, larger, smallest, largest, number names, words to numbers songs. I have added a video clip to the Google Classroom which helps to understand how we teach Maths in Reception and why we do it in this way!

Understanding the World

Past and Present: This half term I will ask you to post pictures of the children with their family. This will encourage the children to talk about members of their family and the relationship to them e.g. Mums, Dads, cousins, sister, brother, grandma, grandad, friends. We will also be learning about local history and castles. **Vocabulary we will use:** older, younger, baby, toddler, child, teenager, adult, elderly.

The Natural World: Children will be exploring what animals need to survive and how that changes depending on the environment they are in.

Vocabulary we will use: animals, habitats, oceans, ponds, forests, urban, camouflaged, survival

People Culture and Communities: Being Special, where do we belong. This investigation enables pupils to think about how each person is unique and valuable. **Vocabulary we will use: Unique, valuable, special**

Expressive Arts and Design

Creating with Materials: through provision in the classroom children will start developing skills and knowledge around printing, colour, painting, cutting and using textiles and materials. They will have access to resources and tools to develop these skills daily as past of the provision available to them. Vocabulary we will use: colour, primary, secondary, light, dark, mix, print, brush, parts, rough, smooth, bendy, creation. Scissor Skills - we will be working on scissor safety and small snips.

Being Imaginative and Expressive: Children have a music and movement lesson with Mr Schofield on a Thursday. In addition to this they will also be singing simple well know songs and rhymes and learning new daily rhymes as part of our classroom routine. We will work on describing the sounds they can hear. **Vocabulary we will use** Pitch, music, singing, songs, nursery rhymes, actions, listen, loud /quiet / fast / slow, dance, shouting, song words, clap, stamp, move

English

Our focus book this half term is: We're going on a Bear Hunt. In addition to our writing around this book children will also have handwriting lessons and will work on spelling, punctuation and grammar within their writing lessons.

Please see phonic sheets sent home on a Wednesday, they will outline the phonic learning for the next week. It is great if children can spend time looking at this with an adult to give them a preview of what we will be learning - great for their memories!

Reading - children will continue to read in school three times a week. This will include a decoding lesson, a prosody lesson and a comprehension lesson. Children will bring a new book home every **Wednesday**. Children should be able to read their book with a high level of accuracy. This does not mean that the book is 'too easy' it allows them to develop their fluency, prosody and comprehension skills and enjoy reading. Please read daily at home where possible.

Subject Vocabulary: Fiction, Non-fiction, capital letter word, sentence, full stop, segmenting fingers, finger spaces. Children will also be exposed to new vocabulary using our class book for inspiration.

Mathematics

This half term children will be working on place value and addition and subtraction within ten.

Subject Vocabulary number, greater than, more than, less than, addition, subtraction, equal/s total.

Science

This half term in Science the children will learn about Animal needs for survival.

Subject Vocabulary: carnivore, herbivore, omnivore, mammal, bird, fish, amphibian, bird, human.

History

In History we will be learning all about local history and Skipton Castle. Year one and two children will visit Skipton Castle.

Mathematics

This half term year 2 children will focus on place value then addition and subtraction. Children will learn to recognise tens and ones, partition numbers, compare and order objects and numbers. They will then learn to add and subtract in a variety of ways.

Science

We will learn about what animals need to survive. We will find out about and describe the basic needs of animals, including humans, for survival (water, food and air).

Subject Vocabulary: mammals, birds, fish, amphibians, reptiles, humans, categorise, survival, carnivore, herbivore, omnivore

History

In History this half term we will be learning about the History of Skipton castle including why it was rebuilt from a Motte and Bailey into a stone castle. The children will relate the building to other times in History that they have already learnt about such as the Great Fire of London.

We will do a spelling test each Friday which will contain some of the words that we have been practising, as well as seme words previously taught.

Mathematics

We will be following the White Rose Maths Hub scheme of work. We will start with our place value topic. This will include representing and partitioning numbers to 1000 in different ways, placing numbers on a number line to 1000, finding 1, 10 and 100 more or less than a number, counting in 50s and comparing and ordering numbers to 1000. We will then move onto addition and subtraction. This will include adding and subtracting 1s, 10s and 100s from 3 digit numbers and adding and subtracting 2 and 3 digit numbers from 3 digit numbers using column method. We will be practising a new times table each week. Please assure that your child is accessing Times Tables Rock Stars. It is a really great way to develop quick recall of tables which is so important in year 3 and year 4!

That is the start of a report we will use for a unit of work called Mars Transmission. We will study the model text discussing any new vocabulary, look at pictures and video clips (of space exploration) to help explain some of the technical vocabulary in context. Then write our own transmission from space.

Our class book, which will read most day, is the ancient Anglo-Saxon tale Beowulf. It will link nicely to the history topic and be used for guided reading session, during which we will practise comprehension skills.

Place value and the four operations will be covered this half term. We will be working on using a formal method for long division as well as introducing the order of operations.

We will looking at living things and their habitat. We will find out about conditions for life, grouping organisms and classifying animals.

Subject Vocabulary: organism, vertebrate, invertebrate, classification, microorganism.

History

Our topic this term is **The Maya Civilisation.** We will be exploring their religion and gods, their number and writing system, their food and drink and their legacy. We will be looking at a box of Maya artefacts to learn more about the civilisation.

Subject Vocabulary: civilisation, glyph, Chichen Itza, Itzamna, Cacao

We will be researching, designing and creating Maya masks.

Art

Physical Education

The PE unit this half term is Invasion Games and Gymnastics.
