Parent Forum—school drop off arrangements.

As you are aware at the last parent forum safeguarding was discussed with parents and carers. It was suggested that we trial not



using the front gate at drop off times. This seems to have worked well—the road at the front of school has been much quieter and therefore safer for everyone. On this basis we have decided to continue using only the church path for drop off in a morning. The front gate will be open at home time but we continue to request that parents and carers park away from school and be courteous to our neighbours whilst also keeping our children safe. Please share this information with anyone dropping off or collecting children on your behalf.

We are very grateful that the White Lion Pub allows us to use the car park at drop off and collection times. Understandably, they have asked that parents and carers do not use the car park for evening events as this is preventing their customers from parking. Kíldwick Fell Race—Tuesday 21st May

Mr Whitehead is the organiser for the Kildwick Fell race—this year it will take place on the 21st May. There will be a full set of races open to all children (not just children from our school) aged 6 and over starting from 6.30pm. I will be sending all parents details and registration forms in book bags and via email over the coming weeks. These need to be filled in and brought to registration at the White Lion on the night. Registration will open at 5.30pm. The adult race will start at 7.30pm and is 3.5 miles. It will be fully flagged and marshalled. It would be brilliant if we could get some of our running parents racing. It is a great route and Mr. Whitehead would be happy to show any prospective parents the race route. 




