On Tuesday 11th June, Year Six will be holding their annual Career Fair. Every year, this is a great success and the children are inspired and educated about a range of exciting careers.



Baskets and boxes


On the 21st June Inset day staff will be working on strategic development of the school for half the day. For the rest of the day

Year 4 Multiplication Check

Year 4 children will be participating in the multiplication tables check (MTC) in June. The purpose of the check is to determine whether your

child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will also help your child's school to identify if your child may need additional support.

What is the multiplication tables check?

It is an on-screen check consisting of 25 times table questions. Your child will be able to answer 3 practice questions before taking the actual check. They will then have 6 seconds to answer each question.

On average, the check should take no longer than 5 minutes to complete.


What if my child cannot access the check?

There are several access arrangements available for the check, which can be used to support pupils with specific needs. Your child's teacher will ensure that the access arrangements are appropriate for your child before they take the check in June. The check was designed to be inclusive and accessible to as many children as possible, including those with special educational needs or disability (SEND). However, there may be some circumstances in which it will not be appropriate for a pupil to take the check, even when using suitable access arrangements. If you have any concerns about your child accessing the check, you should discuss this with Mr Horton or Mrs Snook.

Year One Phonic Screening Check

W/C 10th June 2024

The phonics screening check is a test that Year One pupils in England are required to take.



The test is a statutory assessment that confirms whether or not pupils have met the expected standard in phonic decoding - and can reveal which pupils may need additional support.

The check contains 40 words divided into two sections of 20 words. Both sections contain a mixture of real words and pseudo-words ('alien words' - which are phonically decodable but are not actual words).

Teachers administer the check one-on-one with each pupil and record whether their response to each of the 40 words is correct. Each pupil is awarded a mark between 0 and 40.

Free School Meals / Pupil Premium

If your annual household gross income is below £16, 190 then you can submit a confidential application to the local authority for Pupil Premium funding. It is important that you do this if your family fall into this category as school will receive money to go towards improving educational outcomes for your child. Your child will also be eligible for free school meals in Key Stage Two (universal free school meals are just for EYFS and Key Stage One children). Furthermore, this funding will remain in place until your child reaches the end of primary school, even if your income rises above the threshold. Walk to School Week 20—24th May

This nationwide event is organised by walking charity Living Streets and designed to help pupils experience first-hand the importance of walking to school. Children will be well on their way to reaching their recommended minimum 60 minutes of physical activity per day before even reaching the school gates! Not only will it set them up for a positive day in the classroom, but it will also help create healthy habits for life.

This year's challenge, 'The Magic of Walking', encourages children to travel actively to school every day of the week. Meeting various magical beings along the way, they'll learn about the important reasons to walk and the difference it can make for individuals, communities and the planet! Each pupil will be challenged to travel sustainably (walk, wheel, scoot, cycle or park and stride) to school every day for one week using the wall-chart and stickers to log their journeys. Each class will work collectively to make as many active journeys to school as possible across the week. Individual activity diaries, daily stickers and end of week pupil rewards will complement this activity, reinforcing the benefits and keeping children engaged.

It would be great if you could arrange for your child/ children to travel actively to school on week commencing 20th May, helping our school reduce congestion and pollution around the school gates. In return, your child will earn special stickers and a reward trophy! Walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling all count! If you live far away from school and need to drive or take public transport, try parking the car ten minutes away and walking the rest of the journey.






