If your child does need to bring sunscreen to school to 'top up', it should be clearly labelled but, as you can imagine, staff are unable to apply sunscreen to 30 children throughout the day. A polite reminder to label jumpers and cardigans as children will be taking these off when warm. Clothing is the responsibility of the children

Book Bags—Next year we will be requesting that all children from reception to year five bring only a book bag to school. We are giving advanced warning before parents purchase new bags for the next academic year. Unfortunately we do not have the room in school for large rucksack type bags. Children are only required to bring learning packs and a water bottle each day, these items fit easily into book bags. If you do not have a book bag for your

child and are unable to finance one please let us know and school will source a book bag for you. Children with a packed lunch can bring an additional small lunch bag which will be stored on our packed lunch trolley. Year 6 children can bring a bag of their choice, they have a larger cloakroom area to store their bags.

Please ensure that your child has a named water bottle in school each day.



Grow a Pound

Thank you to everyone who is getting on board with this initiative. The children (and parents) have come up with some great ideas and have already started growing their pounds. Some of these are pictured below and I will feature all of those that send in photos. If you are struggling for ideas, we have listed some below and many more can be found online.

The children have been asked to do something with the £1 to generate more money for school. All the money raised will be used to purchase reading books, new ICT equipment and improve our play-ground.

In addition to raising much needed funds for school, this initiative also gives children an insight into how business works and helps them to build skills for the future, such as team working, problem solving, leadership, money management and creativity. It also supports children in their learning in key elements of the National Curriculum.

Children can work on their own or in a group, they can take a 'loan' if needed and offered by parents, but this money must be taken out of the profits and paid back before the end of the challenge.

To further support the children with their ventures, we will have a 'market place' every Friday from 3:30pm to 3:45pm (starting 12th May). Children can use this opportunity to sell goods and services to their peers. They can use any profit to buy more resources for the following week and increase their stock. We will also be offering advertising space on the weekly Chronicle. Children can design an advertisement to give to the office to scan and add.

The challenge will run from Friday 28th April until Friday 9th June. If your child doesn't wish to participate please return the £1.

There will be a prize for the child/group that 'grow' their pound the HIGHEST and the most original ideas!

Some ideas might be...

- Buy a sponge and some washing up liquid and offer to clean your neighbours' cars £2 a go?
- Buy some ingredients and make some cakes or biscuits for friends and family 50p each? Then use the money made to buy more ingredients – and so on!
- Make up a sponsorship form and do something interesting; sponsored skip, goal-scoring, hop, sing, silence unleash your talents 50p a minute?
- Buy some gardening gloves and do some weeding for your neighbours, friends and family
