

#### Safeguarding Updates

Heather Russell, our Senior Education Adviser, visited school this week with a safeguarding focus. She is aware of the difficulties we face in school with the amount of traffic during drop off and collection times and the safeguarding concerns that this generates. I, along with Heather, have contacted NYC highways on more than one occasion to express these concerns. I will keep you updated with any developments in due course, but if you would like to contact them yourselves, please contact the office for the relevant email details.

In the meantime, to support our efforts, the safest way to access school is via the church path. The road outside school is narrow and has areas without pavements. Parents and families can help in the following ways:

- Not parking on the road outside school or the private land by the school bins
- Walking to school or parking away from school and then walking to school. The walking bus is not an option for all but sets off from the Coop in Cross Hills at 8.30am every Thursday.
- Always choosing the church path to access school.
- Vacating the playground and returning to cars as quickly as possible. We introduced a soft start to the school day to stagger the times that children can be dropped off. This is between 8.45am and 9am.
- Contacting NYC Highways—contact details from school office.
- Reinforcing road safety with children at home (this is part of our PSHE curriculum in school).

Teaching staff will use Marvellous Me to share good news about children with the adults at home. Over the next few weeks we will also be introducing the 'Thumbs Up' function to record house points given n class.



#### <u>SEN</u>



- Has the school had learners with autism before?
- How welcoming do the school and the staff feel?
- What support is provided to learners with autism and other SEND?
