This week has been road safety week. All children have had a road safety lesson as part of our PSHE curriculum. Due to the location of our school this is a priority for us in terms of safeguarding. As you are aware both Mr Whitehead and our Senior Education Advisor have contacted North Yorkshire Highways about the safety of children on the road outside school. If you would like to do the same you can obtain contact details from the school office.

In the meantime, to support our efforts, the safest way to access school is via the church path. The road outside school is narrow and has areas without pavements. Parents and families can also help in the following ways:

- Not parking on the road outside school or the private land by the school bins
- Walking to school or parking away from school and then walking to school. The walking bus is not an option for all but sets off from the Coop in Cross Hills at 8.30am every Thursday. Parent volunteers are welcome to go on a rota to support this initiative please contact Mr. Whitehead.
- Always choosing the church path to access school.
- Vacating the playground and returning to cars as quickly as possible. We introduced a soft start to the school day to stagger the times that children can be dropped off. This is between 8.45am and 9am.
- Contacting NYC Highways—contact details from school office.
- Reinforcing road safety with children as part of your daily routine.

Next week Ruth Pearson from North Yorkshire Police will be leading a whole school road safety session with the children.



Suggested items: Food - Tinned meat, Custard, Tinned fruit, Instant Coffee, Tinned Rice Pudding, Jam/Marmalade, Jars of Pasta Sauce, Tinned veg, e.g. Sweetcorn, Peas, Carrots, Rice, Tinned spaghetti, Tinned tomatoes, Tinned Fish, Quick cook meals - noodles, rice & pasta, UHT milk, Pasta, Soup, Beans, Cereal Toiletries - Toilet roll, Soap, Shampoo, Toothpaste, Toothbrushes, Shower Gel, Sanitary Products, Dog food, Cat food, Nappies (large size 5 or 6 most helpful), Baby wipes, Household cleaning items and washing powder
