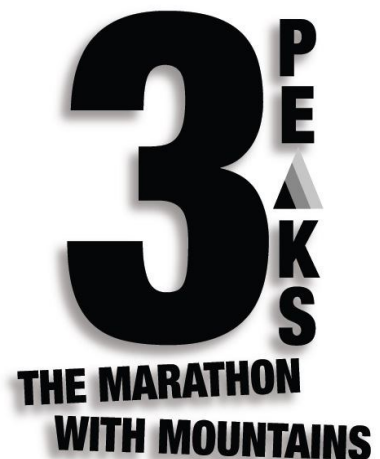


School Fundraising

Staff Training Days

Vision Checks

Following our involvement in the Glasses in Classes scheme, Bradford University have now completed vision checks for all year groups. Of the 143 children on roll, 27 were given letters recommending follow up eye tests at opticians (18% of children in school). These children did not previously know that they might need glasses so the testing has been a success. As of 18th April, we have nine of those children who are now wearing glasses in school. This will have a significant impact on their learning. This project has also helped us to raise awareness of glasses. We also have children in Robins using frames (lens free) in their role play area—please pass on your old glasses (with lenses removed) to us. We would highly recommend registering your child with a local optician and getting regular free eye tests as vision does change as your child grows.

A big thank you to Mrs Kingham who has led on this initiative in school.

4. Be sure to recycle the torn-up paper.

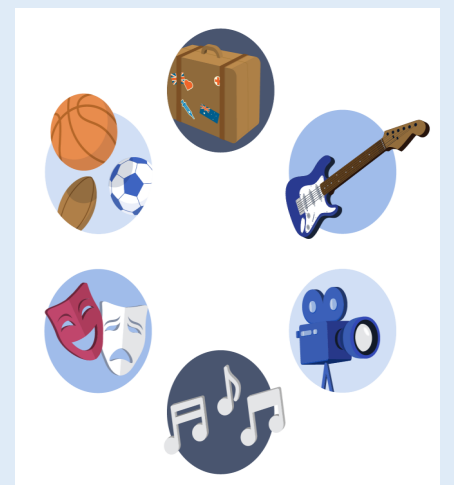



Year One—Phonic Screening Check

W/C 10th June 2024

The phonics screening check is a test that Year One pupils in England are required to take.

The test is a statutory assessment that confirms whether or not pupils have met the expected standard in phonic decoding - and can reveal which pupils may need additional support.

The check contains 40 words divided into two sections of 20 words. Both sections contain a mixture of real words and pseudo-words ('alien words' - which are phonically decodable but are not actual words).

Teachers administer the check one-on-one with each pupil and record whether their response to each of the 40 words is correct. Each pupil is awarded a mark between 0 and 40.

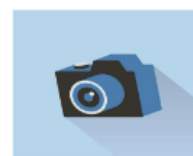

Home learning



A number of children in school have a Nessy account. Nessy is a widely used, evidenced based programme to help support children with phonics and early reading. If your child has been given a Nessy login their class teacher should have made you aware of this. Where possible we would ask that they log on to Nessy at home and complete regular short sessions of learning. This will have a big impact on their reading and writing progress.

School Snacks

A quick reminder that children should only bring fruit to school as their school snack. Robins and Swallows children are provided with free fruit but are still welcome to bring their own snack in addition or as an alternative.

Please remember to send your child to school with a named water bottle. We ask that the children only bring water into school, we encourage children to think about their oral hygiene and the effects of juice (particularly juice being consumed through a bottle.)

Parking Notice

We are very grateful to the Church and to the White Lion Pub who allow us to use their car parks at drop off and collection times. As per last weeks Newsletter, The White Lion ask that parents and carers do not use the car park for evening events as this is preventing their customers from parking.

Reverend Mike remains concerned about inconsiderate parking in the Church car park and has emailed again this week. He is now considering closure of the Church car park at drop off and collection times—we will keep you updated as to his decision. **Please do not park on pathways or block other cars in.**

To alleviate some of the build up of traffic, we have started to open the side gate onto the playground at 8.40am. This now leaves a 20 minute window for drop offs—please return to your car promptly once you have dropped your child off so that others can park. The same applies at home time and we would ask that once children have been collected you return to your car quickly. A reminder that Robins and Swallows can be collected from 3:20pm onwards.

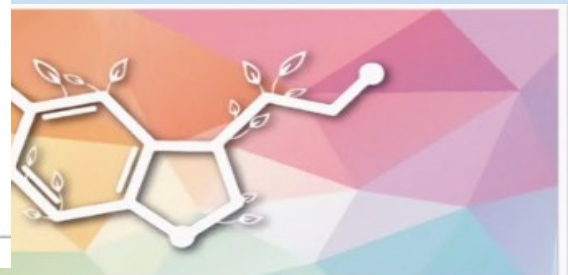

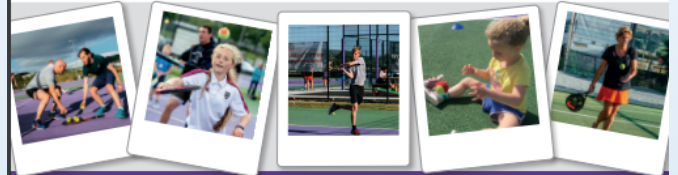
