The ZONES of Regulation

Blue Zone Sad Bored Tired Sick	Green Zone Happy Focused Calm Proud	Yellow Zone Worried Frustrated Silly Excited	Red Zone overjoyed/Elated Panicked Angry Terrified

We are very excited to be launching the Zones of Regulation across the school this term. We hope this will help all the children to learn about their emotions and how to manage them. From time to time, all of us (including adults) find it tricky to manage feelings. Worry, anger, restlessness, fear or tiredness (to name a few) can have a big impact on us and this can stop us from effectively getting on with our day. Children who feel these emotions can often find it hard to concentrate in school and this could have an impact on their learning. The Zones of Regulation aims to teach children good strategies to help them cope with these feelings so they are calm, 'good to go' and ready to learn. This process is called self-regulation and teaching the children effective ways to manage their feelings will support them in later life so they don't turn to negative coping strategies which affect their mental and physical wellbeing.

Our aims to help the children are:

- Recognise when they are in the different Zones and learn how to change or stay in their Zone.
- Increase their emotional vocabulary so they can explain how they feel.
- Recognise when other people are in different Zones, which develops better empathy.
- Develop an insight into why or what makes them move into a different Zone.
- Understanding that emotions, sensory experiences such as hunger, thirst, lack of sleep, getting hot or being cold can effect which Zone they are in.
- Develop problem solving skills and resilience.
- Identify good strategies that support them to feel calm and 'good to go'.

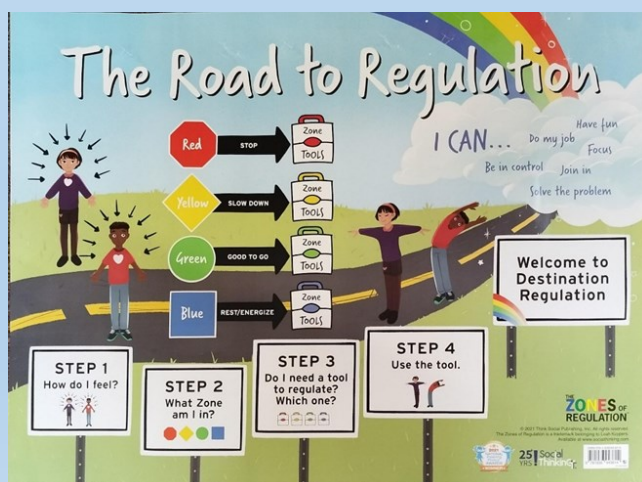

Grow a Pound

Today, all the children have been given a £1 coin to launch their own 'Grow a Pound' venture.

The children then do something with the £1 to generate more money for school. All the money raised will be used to purchase reading books, new ICT equipment and improve our playground.

In addition to raising much needed funds for school, this initiative also gives children an insight into how business works and helps them to build skills for the future, such as team working, problem solving, leadership, money management and creativity. It also supports children in their learning in key elements of the National Curriculum.

We have listed some ideas below and many more can be found online, or the children can come up with their own.

Children can work on their own or in a group, they can take a 'loan' if needed and offered by parents, but this money must be taken out of the profits and paid back before the end of the challenge.

To further support the children with their ventures, we will have a 'market place' every Friday from 3:30pm to 3:45pm (starting 12th May). Children can use this opportunity to sell goods and services to their peers. They can use any profit to buy more resources for the following week and increase their stock. We will also be offering advertising space on the weekly Chronicle. Children can design an advertisement to give to the office to scan and add.

The challenge will run from Friday 28th April until Friday 9th June.

If your child doesn't wish to participate please return the £1.

There will be a prize for the child/group that 'grow' their pound the HIGHEST!

Some ideas might be...

- Buy a sponge and some washing up liquid and offer to clean your neighbours' cars - £2 a go?
- Buy some ingredients and make some cakes or biscuits for friends and family – 50p each? Then use the money made to buy more ingredients – and so on!
- Make up a sponsorship form and do something interesting; sponsored skip, goal-scoring, hop, sing, silence – unleash your talents – 50p a minute?
- Buy some gardening gloves and do some weeding for your neighbours, friends and family - £2 per flower bed
- Buy your mum some flowers and offer to do the housework - £1.50 for all the hoovering?
- Fill a jar with £1 worth of sweets, charge people to guess how many sweets are in the jar.

Bring "grown" funds back to school by Friday 9th June.
