Reception

Summer 2 2022

Reception – What are we learning this half term?

Class Books

This half term we will be reading The Big Blue Whale and Rainbow Fish. we will use these texts to inspire our writing and enhance our understanding of the world.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

PSED is developed through our classroom routines and adult guidance and support in play.

In our PSHE lessons our focus will be all about 'Growing and Changing'. This children will learn about: Seasons; Inside my wonderful body; Taking care of a baby; Then and Now; Me and My body girls and boys.

Communication and Language

We will continue to work on Communication and Language as part of our daily routines. Our approach with children will be 'Time to Share'. We will do this through morning activities, learning songs, Google classroom sessions, Newsround and picture news. We will read aloud books to children that will extend their knowledge of the world and illustrate our learning around our 'What a wonderful world' theme.. We will look at Non Fiction books. Please continue to add pictures to the Google Stream as children love to talk about their homelife and share with friends. This provides us with great learning opportunities at carpet time.

Physical Development

We work hard to develop fine motor skills through our morning activities and continuous provision in the classroom. Children will also have three handwriting sessions a week in a group. I will share our focus letters/numbers on Google Classroom for children to work on at home. Developing gross motor skills supports development of fine motor skills. Children are active through their play and our tyres, crates, scooters and lots of other resources are available all the time to children to help physical development and gross motor skills. Their PE lessons this half term will be Tennis.

Organisation / Updates:

PE – Lessons will be on a Monday Children should come to school in PE kits.

Forest School Session - Friday (please can wellies be left in school to allow for a change of day where staffing requires)

Homework: There will be a homework grid on Google Classroom. This is optional. Please post work on to Google Classroom. Children should read their reading book daily and sharing books frequently! Spellings: Reception children do not get spellings. You will be informed of the graphemes and 'tricky' words they are learning so that they can work these at home. See below and on Google Classroom.

Phonics

This half term children learn as follows:

Week 1: Long vowel sounds CVCC CCVC

Week 2: Long vowel sounds CCVC CCCVC CCV CCVCC

Week 3: Phase 4 words ending –s /s/ –s /z/ ending –es and longer words

Week 4: Root word ending in: –ing, –ed /t/, –ed /id/ /ed/, –ed /d/ Week 5: root word ending in: –er, –est longer words

C- Consonant V -Vowel

We will not be learning any new tricky words this half term. Children should focus on words they are not yet fluent reading and spelling.

Please see Google Classroom for a full list taught taught so far.

Literacy

Children will be encouraged to continue to write independently and spontaneously through provision in the classroom. They will have three short adult led writing sessions where they will work on applying their phonic learning. We will be writing facts about whales and thinking about non-fiction writing. Children should be beginning to use full stops, capital letters and finger spaces. We will also be using Rainbow fish as a familiar text and a model for writing our own stories.

Children will also be given a picture each week to encourage them to compose their own sentence/sentences and work on their writing stamina.

All children will have three adult led reading sessions a week. On a Thursday the book they have been reading in school will be sent home. It is very important that you reread the book when it is sent home, this will help children to read confidently and fluently.

Mathematics

During the second part of the summer term we will continue to consolidate key skills including, subitising, counting, composition, sorting and matching and comparing and ordering.

This half term children will work on adding more and taking away. We will revisit sharing and grouping and then move onto even and odd. Children have worked on doubling in school, please continue to revisit at home. We will then work on applying our Maths skills to problem solving.

<u>Please continue to use your Numbots account as much as possible.</u>
<u>We are seeing lots of progress in those children using it!</u>

Understanding of the World

We are learning all about our 'Wonderful World' this half term. We will think about change in living things. As always we will encourage children to explore the world around us and see how it changes as we enter Summer. Children will be encouraged to note and monitor the weather. We will continue introducing and modelling new vocabulary.

Expressive Art and Design

This half term our adult led focus will be DT. We will revisit different techniques for joining materials and encourage children to think about how and when to use adhesive tape and different sorts of glue.

Provision in the classroom will encourage children to natural creations to make pictures, sculptures, models. Sticks, stones and anything else natural you find on your travels would be most welcome!

Religious Education

In RE this half term we will be thinking about What makes some places sacred to believers? We will be working on understanding that some places are special to members of our community.

Year One

Summer 2 2022

Year One – What are we learning this half term?

English

This half term year one will focus on poetry. Robins class will then move onto 'The Big Blue Whale' and focus on Non Fiction writing again.

Year One children should be using full stops, capital letters and finger spaces. We have also worked on capital letters and exclamation marks.

In Robins and Swallows we will also read a story from our classroom daily. A reminder that children bring home recommended reads as sharing books to read at home with you and talk about. Please try to read these books as they are selected enhance your child's learning of the wonder curriculum.

Phonics

This half term children will be learning the following graphemes in this order:

All children will have a daily phonic lesson. Some children will have four additional 'Keep Up' phonic 1:1 sessions each week. We will email and let you know if your child is attending the keep up sessions. Please read your child's reading book daily. This will have a big impact on their application of phonics to decode and their prosody and comprehension skills.

Music

Year One will be together for their Music and Movement session with Mr Schofield on a Tuesday afternoon.

Google Classroom.

PE – Lessons will be on a Monday.Children should come to school in PE kits.

Swimming - final session 9th June for year one.

Forest Schools - Sessions will be on a Friday. please can wellies be left in school to allow for a change of day where staffing requires)

Homework: There will be a homework grid on Google Classroom.

This is optional but encouraged in Year One. Please post work on to

Spellings: Year One will not be given spellings but the phonemes and tricky words they are learning will be put onto Google Classroom so that you can work on these at home. We suggest one or two a week so as not to overload your child's working memory.

History/Geography

This half term children will be working on Geography. They will learn about the location of countries, continents and oceans of the world in relation to the position of the United Kingdom. Children will develop global awareness by looking in detail at the position of the seven continents and five oceans of the world, understanding that the world is spherical. Children will continue to build on their map skills. They will use atlases, world maps and globes, along with using aerial photographs to recognise human and physical features including landmarks.

Science

This half term we will looking at the seasonal changes between Spring and Summer.

We will also be thinking about STEM careers around us and carrying out activities linked to these. .

Mathematics

Children will be working on multiplication and division before moving onto length and volume. Please see Google classroom for a breakdown of work each week.

Please continue to use Numbots as much as possible at home to help with your child's key Mathematical skills. We are seeing lots of progress in those children using Numbots regularly.

Computing

Our computing topic this half term will be programming.

Physical Education

PE this half term will be Tennis which will be taught Tennis by an external tennis coach. PE will be on a Monday, children should come to school in PE kits.

Year Two – What are we learning this half term?

English

This half term we will be writing to inform.

We will be writing about real life events of ourselves and others and how we can record these simply and clearly.

We will use the book the night pirates and non-fiction texts to create a non Chronological report about pirates. These will include expanded noun phrases for description, commas in a list and varying year 2 punctuation.

Spelling patterns we will learn this half term are; adding ed to words of 1 syllable, the or sound spelt a eg walk, the short vowel sound o eg mother, spelling a pronounced o after w or qu eg want and homophones eg see and sea.

Mathematics

This half term we will we recapping and consolidating any topics that we are less confident with in preparation for year 3.

This will include; fractions ¾ and equivalency of a half and 2/4, telling the time to the nearest 15 minutes and the properties of 2D and 3D shapes including, number of sides, faces and lines of symmetry.

Science

This half term we will looking at the seasonal changes between Spring and Summer.

We will also be thinking about STEM careers around us and carrying out activities linked to these. .

Year Three

Year Three – What are we learning this half term?

English

We will be writing to persuade this half term. We will look at lots of examples of persuasive letters. The topic of this letter will be chosen by the children. We will then build our toolkit of the spelling, punctuation and grammar needed to write a persuasive letter

This will include use of paragraphs to break up the text, adverbs, conjunctions, expanded noun phrases and prepositions to make writing more detailed and interesting.

We will think about how to use argument, counter-argument, rhetorical questions, flattery and exaggeration to persuade. We will also work on proof-reading and editing written work and adding extra words and sentences to improve work.

This half term, we will have an extra focus on handwriting and joining. We will continue to have a weekly spelling rule to practise. Children will be expected to apply these spellings in their work too.

Mathematics

We will be following the White Rose Maths Hub scheme of work. We will continue our topic on money. This will include converting pounds and pence, adding and subtracting money and finding change. We will then move onto time. This will include telling the time to the nearest minute, using 24 hour clock, comparing durations and problem solving with time. We will then do our statistics topic where we will interpret pictograms, bar charts and tables. Finally, we will look at shape. This will include turns and angles, right angles, recognising, describing and making 2D and 3D shapes as well as horizontal and vertical and parallel and perpendicular lines. We will continue to recap aspects of Maths that we have already covered as short starters. We will also continue to practise the multiplication and division facts for the 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables. Please ensure that your child is accessing Times Tables Rock Stars. It is a really great way to develop quick recall of tables which is so important in year 3 and year 4!

Science

Our topic this half term is **the Water Cycle.** The children will by the end of the unit know that the water cycle is the journey water takes as it moves from the land to the sky and back again. It follows a cycle of evaporation, condensation, precipitation and collection.

Organisation / Updates:

Kingfishers PE: Kingfishers will be doing PE on Mondays this half term. They will need to wear their PE kit to school for this.

Forest School will take place on Fridays this half term. This will sometimes be forest school and sometimes be PE so children will need to wear PE kit and appropriate shoes for the rec for this.

Homework: A homework grid of activities will be posted on Google Classroom in the first week of the half term. Pick one activity from this each week to do. Home learning can be posted online or brought into school.

Spellings: Will be posted with the home learning in the Google Classroom. Children will be tested on a Friday. The spellings will also be set on Spelling Shed so that children can play these games at home to practise.

Times tables: Will be posted with the home learning in the Google Classroom. Children are expected to learn to quickly recall times table and division facts. The weekly times table will also be set on TT Rockstars for children to practise.

History/Geography

This will include use of paragraphs to break up the text, fronted adverbials and adverbs, conjunctions, expanded noun phrases and prepositional phrases to make writing more detailed and interesting.

We will think about how to use argument, counter-argument, rhetorical questions flattery and exaggeration to persuade. We will also work on proof-reading and editing written work and adding extra words and sentences to improve work. This half term, we will have an extra focus on handwriting and joining. We will continue to have a weekly spelling rule to practise. Children will be expected to apply these spellings in their work too.

Owls

As above but before we look at letters, we will be looking at tourist information leaflets first creating persuasive leaflets for places in the UK.

Mathematics

Kingfishers and Owls

We will be following the White Rose Maths Hub scheme of work. We will be continuing our decimals topic. This will include comparing, ordering and rounding decimals. Then, we will look at money. This will include converting pounds and pence, ordering and estimating money and problem solving with money. After this, we will then move onto time. We will recap telling the time to the minute before moving onto analogue to digital, digital to analogue and 12 hour and 24 hour clocks. After this, we will interpret charts and line graphs as part of our statistics topic, before finishing with shape. We will compare and order angles, learn about triangles and quadrilaterals, look at position and direction as well as lines of symmetry. We will continue to recap aspects of Maths that we have already covered as short starters. We will also continue to practise the multiplication and division facts for all of the times tables. Please ensure that your child is accessing Times Tables Rock Stars. It is a really great way to develop quick recall of tables which is so important in year 4!

Science

This will include use of paragraphs to break up the text, fronted adverbials and adverbs, subordinating conjunctions, noun phrases modified by prepositional phrases, modal verbs and relative clauses to make writing more detailed and interesting.

We will think about how to use argument, counter-argument, rhetorical questions, flattery and exaggeration to persuade. We will also work on proofreading and editing written work and adding extra words and sentences to improve work.

This half term, we will have an extra focus on handwriting and joining. We will continue to have a weekly spelling rule to practise. Children will be expected to apply these spellings in their work too.

Mathematics

We will continue to follow the White Rose Maths Hub scheme of work. The main focus of the half term will be time, statistics and geometry. Children will learn to convert units of time, analogue to digital and how to read timetables. Then we will cover bar charts, line graphs and tables. Followed by angles, symmetry, 2D and 3D shapes. The final units teach understanding position on a grid, movement on a grid and reflections.

Children have access to Times Tables Rock Stars in and out of school. It is a really great way to develop quick recall of tables which is so important for making multiplication and division calculations easier. We will be practising times tables daily in school too.

Science

Our topic this half term is **the Water Cycle.** The children will by the end of the unit know that the water cycle is the journey water takes as it moves from the land to the sky and back again. It follows a cycle of evaporation, condensation, precipitation and collection.

Organisation / Updates:

PE: We will be doing PE on Mondays this half term. They will need to wear their PE kit to school for this.

Forest School will take place on Fridays this half term. This will sometimes be forest school and sometimes be PE so children will need to wear PE kit and appropriate shoes for the rec for this.

Homework: A homework grid of activities will be posted on Google Classroom in the first week of the half term. Pick one activity from this each week to do. Home learning can be posted online or brought into school.

Spellings: Will be posted with the home learning in the Google Classroom. Children will be tested on a Friday. The spellings will also be set on Spelling Shed so that children can play these games at home to practise.

Times tables: Will be posted with the home learning in the Google Classroom. Children are expected to learn to quickly recall times table and division facts. The weekly times table will also be set on TT Rockstars for children to practise.

Spanish

This half term, our topic is about being at school.

Geography

Our geography topic this half term is "the UK". We will learn:

- to locate countries, cities and counties of the UK
- about the rivers, coasts, mountains and seas of the UK
- to compare two regions of the UK and their physical and human features
- to use the eight points of a compass, four figure grid references, symbols and keys

Music

Our Music topic this half term is, "How does music connect us to our planet?"

Computing

In computing this half term we will be learning about computational thinking. We will learn:

- the four strands of computational thinking
- using decomposition to solve problems
- what pattern recognition and abstraction are
- how to create an algorithm

Physical Education

We will be doing athletics in PE this half term. PE kit will need to be worn on Monday for this. On Fridays we will do PE or Forest School. Children will need to wear PE kit and bring appropriate footwear for the rec for this.

Religious Education

The RE unit this half term is 'Is it better to express your religion in arts and architecture or charity and generosity?'

Art & Design

We will finish our dragons art project this half term which will include learning to make dragon sculptures. We will also do a DT picnic food project. This will involve investigating, designing, making and evaluating picnic food!

PSHE

Our PSHE topic this half term is "Growing and changing". This will involve looking at puberty changes, the menstrual cycle, how mammals are born, the difference between secrets and surprises, and civil partnerships and marriage.
