You will find vocabulary for each subject area which we would encourage you to use with your child/ren as you go about your family routines. This will really help them with their learning next half term.

Communication and Language

We will continue to develop communication and language skills through our daily classroom routines and daily activities. We will work on responding skills with a focus on predictions in whole class stories. Children play in the indoor and outdoor provision every day and adults will use this opportunity to model conversations to encourage and develop communication and language skills. Some children have specific Verbo targets, you will have been told if your child is receiving one to one/group support in this area of learning.

Physical Development

Gross Motor Skills: Our adult led PE session this half term will be tennis. Children will be taught by a professional tennis coach from Skipton Tennis Centre. **PE will be on a Friday - please send children in PE kits.** We will have opportunity to play outside everyday with resources to develop our gross motor skills.

Vocabulary we will use: pace, balance, sharing and taking turns.

Fine Motor Skills: Children will work on developing their fine motor skills and aim to be writing and forming recognisable letters. Letter formation rhymes are on the Google Classroom for your information. Children have continuous access to resources to enhance and develop fine motor skills.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

This half term we will be learning about, 'Being My Best'. This will cover: healthy eating, exercise and personal development.

Vocabulary we will use: healthy, fruit, vegetables, hygiene, germs, praise, encourage, feelings.

Literacy

Comprehension: Children will continue to read with an adult in small groups on a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and bring home the books they have been reading on a Wednesday. When reading as a whole class we will be talking about texts and the children will be asked questions about books that we read together. It is a good idea to do this at home with the sharing books we send home each Wednesday.

Word reading: We will continue with our daily phonic lessons in addition to three reading lessons. This half term we will teach as follows: words with two consonant sounds together eg 'stop', compound words and root words ending in:—ing, —ed /t/, —ed /id/ /ed/ —est

Tricky words: said, so, have, like, some, come, love, do, were, here, little, says, there, when, what, one, out, today.

Writing: Our writing this half term will be based on the non fiction text, 'Here we Are'. Children will write daily in their phonic lesson. They will also complete two English activities weekly when they will work with an adult to compose sentences. Children will be working on segmenting consonant, vowel, consonant words (CVC words) Vocabulary we will use: sentences, words, vocabulary, segment, segmenting fingers.

Maths

This half term children will be working on numbers to 20 and beyond. We will be thinking about adding more and taking away. Please encourage children to spend time on numbots at home - this has a big impact on early Maths development.

Vocabulary we will use: subitising, more than, less than, whole part, part of, groups, double, add, take away, subtraction.

Understanding the World

Past and Present: Children will learn about what seaside holidays in the past were like.

Vocabulary we will use: now, then, past, present, memory, modern, different, same, change, bathing machine, Punch & Judy.

The Natural World: Children will be learning about plants and will be able to name common wild and garden plants.

Vocabulary we will use: trunk, branches, crown, roots, stem, leaves, petals, wild, garden, air, food, light

People Culture and Communities:This half term we will be learning all about caring for the world and others.

Vocabulary we will use: responsibilities, feelings, friendships, charity.

Expressive Arts and Design

Creating with Materials: Children will be working with textiles and making bookmarks.

Vocabulary we will use: thread, weave, push, pull, under, over, pattern.

Scissor Skills - children will be working on cutting different shapes and materials.

Being Imaginative and Expressive: this half term children will continue to work on continuation of beat, rhythm and pitch; experience tempo and dynamics; introduction to basic instruments **Vocabulary we will use:** Fast and slow, loud and quiet, piano, drums, recorder, guitar, whisper and shout.

English

Robins will focus on the text, 'Here We Are'. Swallows focus on the text Grandad's Camper. In addition to our writing around this text children will also have handwriting lessons and will work on spelling, punctuation and grammar within their writing lessons. Please see phonic sheets sent home on a Wednesday, they will outline the phonic learning for the next week. It is great if children can spend time looking at this with an adult to give them a preview of what we will be learning.

Reading - children will continue to read in school three times a week. This will include a decoding lesson, a prosody lesson and a comprehension lesson. Children will bring a new book home every **Wednesday**. Children should be able to read their book with a high level of accuracy. **This does not mean that the book is 'too easy' it allows them to develop their fluency, prosody and comprehension skills and enjoy reading.** Please read daily at home where possible.

Subject Vocabulary: fiction, non-fiction, capital letter word, sentence, full stop, segmenting fingers, finger spaces. Children will also be exposed to new vocabulary using our class book for inspiration.

Mathematics

This half term children will start by working on multiplication and division, learning how to: count in 2s, 10s and 5s, using doubles, making equal groups and sharing into groups. We will then move onto fractions learning about halves and quarters. Finally, we will focus on position and direction: moving forwards, backwards, left, right, above and below.

Subject Vocabulary: count up, count back, equal groups, columns, rows, arrays, equal groups, sharing, half, quarter, quantity, fraction, whole, parts, forwards, backwards, left, right, above, below.

Science

This half term in Science children will be learning all about plants. We will learn about the parts of trees and plants be able to identify and classify some wild and garden plants.

Subject Vocabulary: trunk, branches, crown, roots, stem, leaves, petals, wild, garden, air, food, light

History

This half term children will be learning about seaside holidays in the past. They will be comparing them to seaside holidays they go on now.

Subject Vocabulary: now then, past, present, memory, modern, different, same, change, bathing machine, Punch and Judy.

DT

In DT this half term we will be designing and creating pouches.

Subject Vocabulary: design, evaluation, joining, running stitch, fabric, needle.

Physical Education

PE is on a Friday.

All children will have tennis coaching with a professional tennis coach from Skipton Tennis Centre.

Subject Vocabulary: racket, game, ball, net, rally, balance, serve

PSHE

In PSHE we will be learning about, 'Being My Best'. This will cover: healthy eating, exercise and personal development.

Subject Vocabulary: healthy, fruit, vegetables, hygiene, germs, praise, encourage, feelings.

Religious Education

In RE children will be considering - How should we care for the world and others?

Subject Vocabulary: responsibilities, feelings, friendships, charity.

Music

Year 1 will be continuing to increase their rhythmic repertoire, learning to compose simple rhythm patterns.

Subject Vocabulary: beat, pitch, rhythm, round, forte, piano.

Computing

In the spring term our focus will be an introductions to data.

Subject Vocabulary - data, input, pie chart, block graph, pie chart, pictogram, tally, precord.

English

Writing - This half term our focus text will be Grandad's Camper. We will also be writing instructions.

Spellings - **Tricky words**; beautiful, laugh, busy, pretty, parents, because. **Homophones**; be/bee hear/here bear/bare their/ there/they're

Spelling patterns: Why does 'c' make the sound /s/ in some words? How can I spell the sound /zh/? What happens when I add the suffixes -ment, -ness, -ful -less and -ly to a root word? How can I show missing letters in a word?

Reading - Children will continue with three reading sessions a week. Books will usually be changed on a Wednesday. Please ensure your child has their book in school ready to change.

Subject Vocabulary: capital letter, full stop, question mark, sentence, segmenting fingers, finger space, punctuation, comma, expanded noun phrase

Mathematics

Children will learn about mass, capacity and temperature before moving onto fractions. Children will compare mass followed by volume and capacity. Within our fractions unit children will learn to identify a half, one, two and three quarters and a third of both shapes and numbers.

Subject Vocabulary: gram, kilogram, millilitre, litre, volume, capacity, equal, unequal, half, quarter, three quarters, a third

Science

This half term during science lessons children will learn about plants. We will be caring for potato plants; learning about the parts of trees and plants, identifying wild and garden plants and learning what plants need to survive.

Subject Vocabulary: trunk, branches, crown, roots, stem, leaves, petals, wild, garden, air, food, light

History

in History this half term we will be comparing seaside towns and holidays from the past to now.

Subject Vocabulary: promenade, tourist, beach, punch and judy, beach hut, bathing machine, invented, deckchair, entertainment, now, then, past, present, Victorian

Physical Education

Year 2 children will be swimming on a **Thursday** afternoon and Tennis with Skipton Tennis Centre on a **Friday**.

Subject Vocabulary: racket, game, ball, net, rally, balance, serve

DT

In DT this half term we will be designing and creating pouches.

Subject Vocabulary: design, evaluation, joining, running stitch, fabric, needle

PSHE

In PSHE we will be learning about being our best. This will cover healthy eating, exercise and personal development.

Subject Vocabulary: healthy, fruit, vegetables, hygiene, germs, praise, encourage, feelings

Religious Education

The question we will will explore is 'How we should care for the world and others?'

Subject Vocabulary: responsibilities, feelings, friendships, charity

Music

Year 2 will be continuing to increase their rhythmic repertoire, learning to compose simple rhythm patterns and singing in a round. We will learn a new instrument each week.

Subject Vocabulary: beat, pitch, rhythm, round, forte, piano.

Computing

This half term we will be looking at Data handling, this will be linked to an international space station.

Subject Vocabulary: algorithm, data, satellite, International space station, temperature, insulation, digital content

English

This half term we will be writing a narrative piece. The children will create their own narrative after first exploring the techniques used in 'The Magic Paintbrush'. This will include using dialogue, similes, prepositional phrases, time adverbials, alliteration, conjunctions and noun phrases. Their aim will be to create their own traditional tale.

The children will also continue to have their weekly spellings. These are set on the google classroom and handed to the children at school. Spellings tests will take place on a Friday.

Subject Vocabulary: dialogue, similes, prepositional phrases, time adverbials, alliteration, conjunctions, noun phrases, paragraphs

Mathematics

We will be following the White Rose Maths Hub scheme of work. We will be continuing our fractions topic and then moving onto exploring money. We will be practising a new times table each week. Please ensure that your child is accessing Times Tables Rock Stars. It is a really great way to develop quick recall of tables which is so important in year 3 and year 4!

Subject Vocabulary: numerator, denominator, whole, mass, kilograms, grams, milliliters, litres, capacity, volume, pounds, pence, change.

Science

Our topic this half term is plants. In this topic we will be covering the following lesson sequence: 1. Parts of a plant 2. Plant dissection 3. Plant growth 4. The stem and water transportation 5. Looking at seeds 6. Reproductive parts in plants 7. Pollination 8. Seed dispersal 9. Life cycle of plants

Computing

Kingfishers will explore the topic of data handling. in this topic they will learn the key skills of using logical thinking to explore more complex software; predicting, testing and explaining what it does. Learning about the pros and cons of digital versus paper databases. Sorting and filtering databases to easily retrieve information.

Creating and interpreting charts and graphs to understand data.

Subject Vocabulary: field, record, data.

English

Kingfishers will be writing a narrative piece. The children will create their own narrative after first exploring the techniques used in 'The Magic Paintbrush'. This will include using dialogue, similes, prepositional phrases, time adverbials, alliteration, conjunctions and noun phrases. Their aim will be to create their own traditional tale.

Owls will read and study the book 'Cosmic by Frank Cottrell Boyce. The main character is Liam and he is too big for his boots. And his football strip. And his school blazer. But being super-sized height-wise has its advantages: he's the only eleven-year-old to ever ride the G-force-defying Cosmic roller coaster - or to be offered the chance to drive a Porsche. Long-legged Liam makes a giant leap for boy-kind by competing with a group of adults for the chance to go into space. Is Liam the best boy for the job? Sometimes being big isn't all about being a grown-up.

Subject Vocabulary: expanded noun phrase, simile, metaphone, onomatopoeia, relative clause, alliteration, fronted adverbials, contrasting conjunctions, speech

Mathematics

We will start by continuing our fractions topic, where we will learn about fractions beyond 1, mixed number fractions, including on a number line, comparing and ordering mixed number fractions, converting mixed number to improper fractions, equivalent fractions and adding and subtracting mixed number fractions. Then, we will move on to decimals including money, where we will look at tenths and hundredths as decimals, dividing 1 and 2 digit numbers by 10 and 100, pounds and pence and converting pounds and pence, ordering money, adding and subtracting money, giving change and solving money problems. We will continue to practise all 12 times tables so that we can recall them fluently and quickly.

Subject Vocabulary: equivalent, mixed number, numerator, denominator, convert, divide, tenth, hundredth, decimal point, place value, equivalent, pounds, pence, add, subtract, multiply, divide, change, estimate, convert.

Science

Subject Vocabulary: modal verb, relative pronoun, relative clause, parenthesis, bracket, dash, cohesion, ambiguity, adverbial, metaphor, superlative, colon, alliteration, expanded noun phrase, rhetorical question, superlatives, fronted adverbial, subordinate conjunction

Mathematics

This half term, we will focus on decimals and percentages first before moving onto perimeter and area. Finally, Year 5 children will study statistics. Throughout the term we will be revisiting content from previous topics to consolidate the children's learning, in particular fractions and knowledge of formal methods of calculation.

Subject Vocabulary: metre, kilometer, polygon, rectilinear, shape, perimeter, side, right angle, length, width, equivalent, decimals, percentage.

Science

This is one of the first units to encourage slightly more complex and sophisticated writing using a wider range of vocabulary.

Physical Education

PE lessons for Owls will happen on Tuesdays and Thursdays and the topics will continue to be tri-golf and forest school sessions on the Rec.

Religious Education

Mrs Oswald will explore the question 'When Jesus left, what is the impact of Pentecost?'

Subject Vocabulary: spirit, church, ascension, resurrect, disciples

Music

Children will learn to sing and perform sea shanties.

Subject Vocabulary: concerto, motif, programme music, pitched percussion, unpitched percussion

PSHE

The PSHE unit for this half term is called "Being my best". We will learn about healthy eating, preventing illness, making choices about our health and individual qualities and talents.

Subject Vocabulary: balanced diet, food groups, hygiene, medicine, talents, unique.

English

Our writing will be based on the picture book Rose Blanche and our History topic of World War Two. We will be completing several pieces of writing of different genres to show off the Year Six writing skills that we have acquired over the course of the year.

Subject Vocabulary: semi colon, colon, clause, subjunctive form, passive, active.

Mathematics

Measuring angles and working with reflections and translations of shape will be our focus for this half term. We will continue revision of all other previous Maths topics too.

Subject Vocabulary: acute, obtuse, reflex, protractor, axis.

Science

We will be finding out about variations and adaptations. We will learn about adaptations that plants and animals have made. We will also find out about evolution and Charles Darwin.

Subject Vocabulary: evolution, natural selection, characteristics, habitat, inheritance., species.

History

Our History topic this half term is World War Two and what Kildwick was like during the war. We will be visiting Eden Camp to help us find out more about life during WW2.

Subject Vocabulary: rationing, evacuation, Axis, Allies, invade, prisoner of war

DT

We will be looking at seasonality in food and planning a seasonal meal. We will link our DT to British culture and history before creating a dish at the end of term.

Subject Vocabulary: seasonality, flavour.

Physical Education

The PE units this half term are health related fitness and gymnastics.

Subject Vocabulary: unison, sequence, fitness, circuit.

Religious Education

The topic this half term is called 'What does it mean for Muslims to follow God?'.

Subject Vocabulary: Five Pillars, submission, obedience, generosity, self control, worship.

PSHE

The topic this half term is 'Being My Best'. We will think about well-being and taking risks.

Subject Vocabulary: mental well-being, safety.

Music

Grazyna Bacewicz 'Overture' - exploring Morse code motifs.

Subject Vocabulary: Coda, fanfare, crescendo, graphic score, orchestrate, overture,.

Spanish

Our Spanish this half term is about World War Two. We will be working on decoding texts written in Spanish.

Subject Vocabulary: La Segunda Guerra Mundial

Computing

Big data part one - children will create and scan their own QR code.

Subject Vocabulary: algorithm, barcode, RFID, QR code
