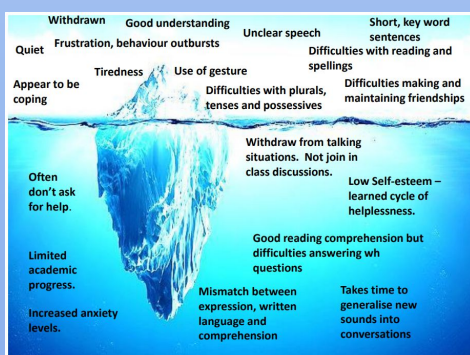
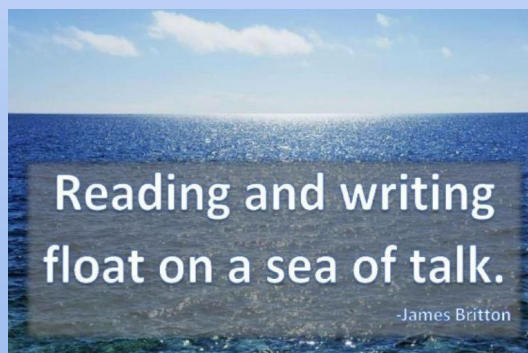


## **SEND @ Kildwick**

Our school SENCo is Miss Akrigg. You can find information regarding SEND at Kildwick on the website [here](#).

It is important that everyone in our school community understands about SEND. Even if your child does not have Special Educational Needs they will be in class with children who do. We are an inclusive school and it is important that all members of our school community understand and value **all children in our school**.

**Mrs Kingham is going to be doing some training on Speech Sound Disorder training. If you are concerned about your child's speech please speak to your child's Class Teacher. We felt that some of the course information would be helpful to share with parents. Please see below.**



### Speech Disorder

Unusual substitutions, sounds not being acquired in a typical order, early sounds may be inaccurate, e.g:

- 'm' for 'b'.
- 'k' for 't'.
- omitting sounds from the starts of words (later than 2 ½ years old).
- Using /h/ or glottal stop substitutions.

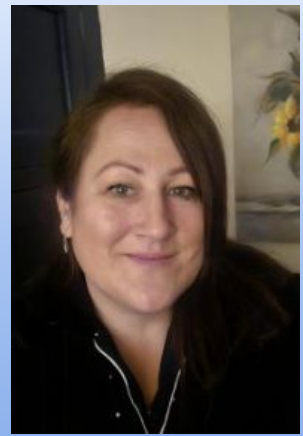
If you are struggling to make payments please do contact us. We are here to help and as an inclusive school will always make sure that it is possible for all children to take part in everything that we offer as a school.

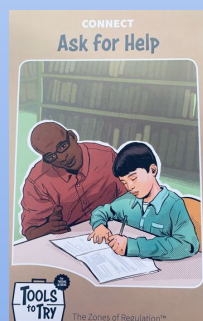

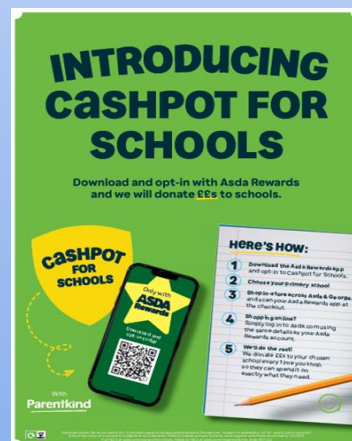

## Meet the Team

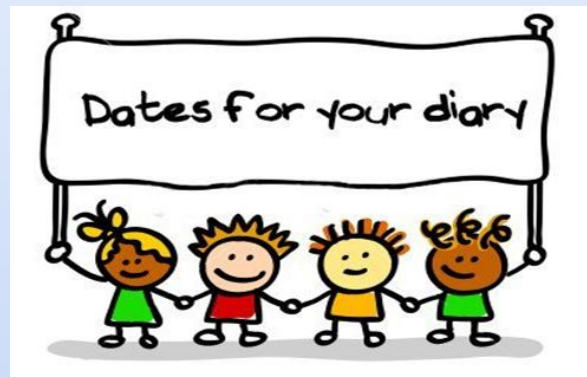

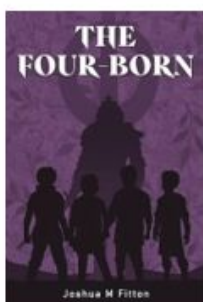
