Year Six have written and sent the letter below to North Yorkshire County Council, other classes made posters and also wrote letters.

Today, we were excited to welcome Jamie Knight to our school for an exciting day of freestyle football. Jamie featured in Ireland's Got Talent and was very well received by the children. He led a whole school inspirational session, followed by workshops tailored for each year group, it's been a day full of fun and learning for everyone.

Dear North Yorkshire Council,

Request for Improved Signage Outside Kildwick Primary School

We are writing as concerned pupils of Kildwick Primary School to urge you to act in improving road safety outside our school. Currently, the lack of adequate signage warning drivers about the presence of children has created significant risks to our safety and well-being.

Safety Concerns
Our visitors have repeatedly highlighted the lack of clear signage as a safeguarding issue. The current situation puts us, as pupils, in danger every day, especially during drop-off and pick-up times.

History of Accidents in the Area
While we are grateful that no serious incidents have occurred yet, there have been frequent near-misses involving vehicles and children. This is a clear indication of the urgent need for preventive measures before an avoidable accident occurs.

Volume of Road Users
The road outside our school is heavily used as a shortcut by drivers. This increases the risk for the 140 children attending our school, who navigate this busy environment daily.

Environmental Impact
Slowing traffic with better signage would not only improve safety but also reduce vehicle emissions in our village. This would contribute to a healthier environment for everyone in the community.

Cost
We understand that funding can be a challenge, but the cost of installing effective warning signs is relatively low—approximately £600 per sign. Compared to the potential cost of an accident, this is a small price to pay for safeguarding our lives.

Priority Compared to Other Requests
We believe that the safety of children should be a top priority. Investing in road safety outside a primary school benefits not only us but also the broader community by preventing harm and promoting a safer environment.

Alternative Solutions
The school has tried to address this issue independently by purchasing freestanding signs. Unfortunately, these were frequently damaged or knocked over by passing vehicles, further demonstrating the need for a more robust, council-supported solution.

We kindly ask you to consider our request and take action to install permanent signage outside Kildwick Primary School as soon as possible. We have seen flashing lights outside other schools, and we think signs like the one below would be suitable for our school.



Your support would mean a safer journey for us all and greater peace of mind for our families. Thank you for your time and attention. We will also be writing to Kildwick Parish Council to hopefully secure their support so that we make this critical improvement a reality.

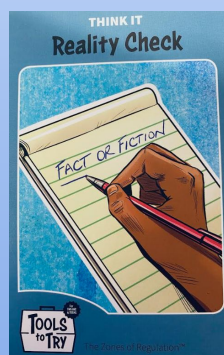

THINK IT Reality Check

When you are stressed or overwhelmed, make a list or map out your thoughts. Then ask yourself, which of these thoughts are true and which of them are false? Consider what is really going on vs. what you "think" may be the case. Check in with a trusted adult to get his or her perspective and support.

Why to try?

Sometimes, our minds may latch onto thoughts that aren't likely to happen, yet we may keep spinning them around in our head. Reality checks help put things in perspective.

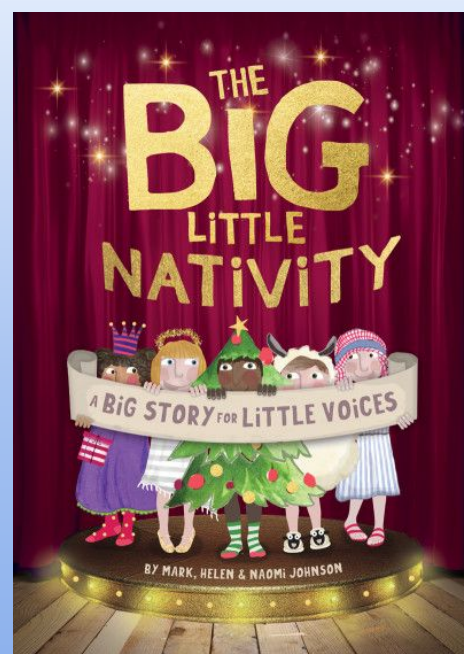

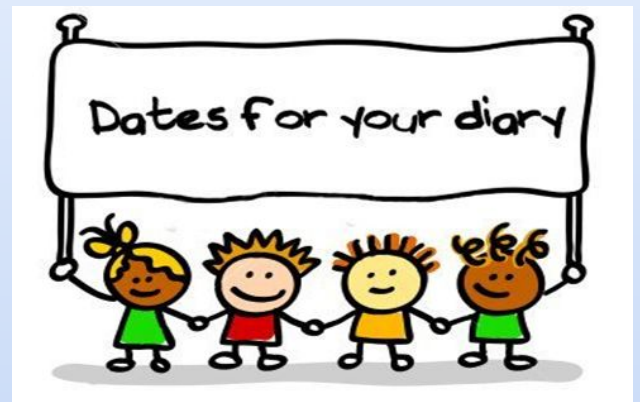
I also run an after school construction club on a Wednesday after school. I really enjoy this time as it lets the children use their imagination and creativity.
