Key Stage Two Write For You!

Last week we were learning all about how to stay safe near roads. Some top tips that we have come up with for being safe near the road include wearing bright clothing so that cars can see you and using the green cross code of think, stop, look and listen before you cross. We also thought about not crossing between cars where possible and using zebra crossings and traffic lights. In Key Stage Two, we have been writing to North Yorkshire Council to try to persuade them to add more safety markings to the road outside school. We are an inclusive school and it is important that all members of our school community understand and value all children in our school.




