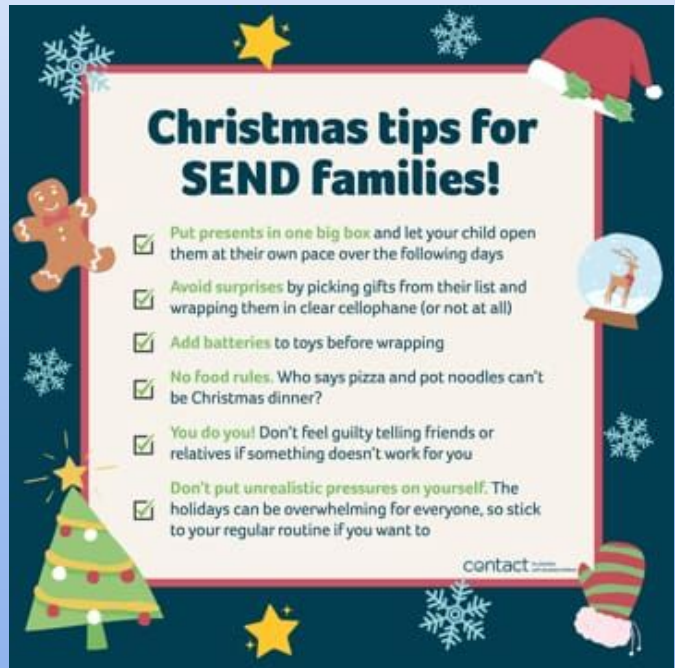

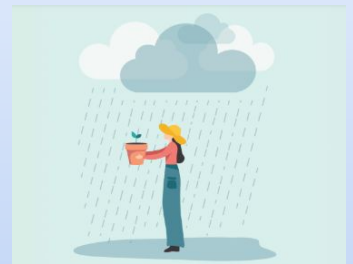

It is important that everyone in our school community understands about SEND. Even if your child does not have Special Educational Needs they are in class with children who do. We are an inclusive school and it is important that all members of our school community understand and value **all children in our school**.



Top Tips from Mrs Swales - Resilience

Life can be tricky to navigate sometimes and for children, throughout their childhood, learning resilience is an important part of development enabling them to thrive, bounce back when things get challenging and achieve. These top tips from the NHS (Bradford) website will help you to help your child build resilience and develop the ability to problem solve when faced with unfamiliar or tough situations.



- Don't overprotect – it can sometimes fuel a child's anxiety.
- Allow appropriate risks and teach essential skills – giving children age-appropriate freedom helps them learn their own limits.
- Teach your child to problem-solve – engage them in figuring out how they can handle challenges again and again.
- Teach skills to handle certain situations – for example, teach a shy child how to greet someone and start a conversation.
- Ask 'how?' not 'why?' questions – for example, "How do you get yourself out of bed when it's warm and cosy?"
- Don't provide all the answers – saying "I don't know" and promoting problem-solving helps children learn to tolerate uncertainty and think about ways to deal with potential challenges.
- Avoid talking in worst case scenario terms – pay attention to what you say to and around your kids. Anxious parents tend to talk catastrophically around their children.
- Let your child make mistakes – so they learn how to fix them and make better decisions the next time.
- Help your child to manage their emotions – this is key to resilience! Teach them that all emotions are okay and to think through what they will do next. For example, if your child throws a tantrum, be clear about what behaviour is appropriate (and inappropriate). *Use Zones of Regulation at home.
- Model resiliency – children learn from observing their parents' behaviour. Try to be calm and consistent. There is no handbook for parenting and we all make mistakes. When you do make a mistake, admit it to your child.

We will not be restricting places but would ask that you only attend one performance to ensure that everyone, who wants to, has the opportunity to watch. Usually the afternoon performance is less well attended.

Please let us know as soon as possible if your child is **not** able to attend the after school nativity at 5.00pm. If this is the case we may need to change the part to make sure there is minimal impact on the performance. **Your child will need to be back in school by 4:45pm to get ready for this performance.**

If you have been asked to provide a costume please bring them into school on Monday 9th December 2024.

MOVE IT

Tense and Relax

Find a comfortable position. Squeeze, and then relax, each of your body parts one at a time for five seconds in the following order:

1. Toes and feet
2. Legs and bottom
3. Belly and chest
4. Arms and fingers
5. Shoulders and neck
6. Face and tongue

Why to try?

Tense and Relax is a mind/body technique that helps us notice the difference between tight versus relaxed muscles. Developing awareness of when our muscles are tense helps us recognize when we need to release the tension in them to relax.

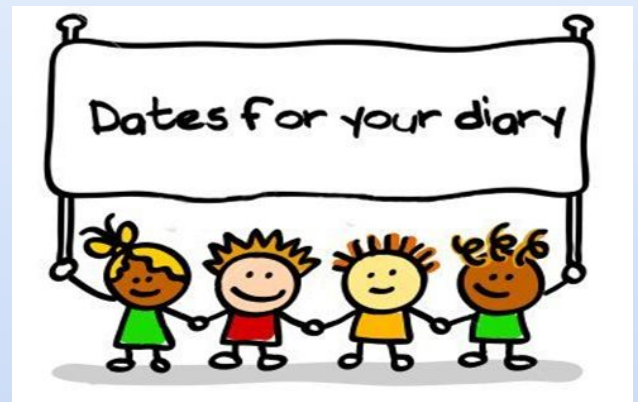




