Welcome to the Autumn Two curriculum newsletter! This is your opportunity to learn about what your children will be focusing on when we return after the half-term break. We've included vocabulary for each subject area, which we encourage you to incorporate into your routines at home to help reinforce your children's learning.

Thank you for your continued support with home learning; we're proud of the strong parental involvement in our school community.

The next half-term is always bustling with Christmas activities, providing both fun and opportunities to create lasting memories. We recognize that this season can be challenging for some children due to changes in routine, and we are committed to making adjustments to meet their needs. We invite you to help out the PTA during fundraising events—these not only support our school financially but also foster a sense of community and shared experiences for our children.

For our returning families, and as an introduction for new ones, we'd like to recap our curriculum approach. Last year, we focused on building knowledge systematically through sequenced steps, ensuring connections across subjects to deepen understanding. Our goal is to enhance learning without overwhelming students, reinforcing their existing knowledge before introducing new concepts.

At the beginning of each new unit, we'll conduct pre-learning checks to assess what your child remembers from previous lessons. Each lesson will include a "Remembering Red Recap" to reinforce prior learning. After completing a unit, children will participate in knowledge checks at two, six, and twelve-week intervals, which will be documented in their individual "File of Knowledge." This strategy is designed to help children develop fluency and automaticity in essential knowledge and skills, ensuring that learning is lasting and impactful.

We look forward to seeing you all at events and activities leading up to the festive period.

On Friday 22nd November we have arranged for Jamie Knight to visit school for a day of freestyle football.

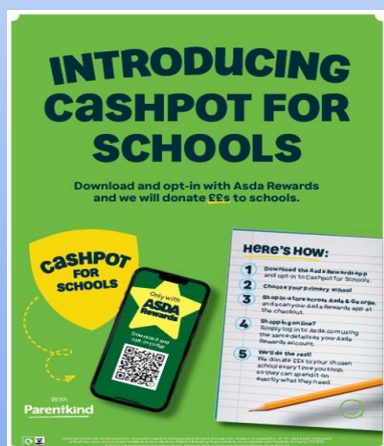

Communication and Language

We will continue to develop communication and language skills through our daily classroom routines and daily activities. Children will have lots of opportunities to talk during carpet time, group tasks, playing, and general discussions. We sing learning songs and rhymes which we will build up across the year. Children play in the indoor and outdoor provision every day and adults will use this opportunity to encourage and develop Communication and Language skills. Some children have specific verbal targets, you will have been told if your child is receiving one to one / group support in this area of learning.

Physical Development

Gross Motor Skills: Our adult led PE session this half term will be gymnastics. We will have opportunity to play outside everyday with resources to develop our gross motor skills.

Vocabulary we will use: travel, rock, jump, forward roll, balance.

Fine Motor Skills: Children will work on developing their fine motor skills ready for writing and forming recognisable letters. Letter formation rhymes are on the Google Classroom for your information. Children have continuous access to resources to enhance and develop fine motor skills.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

In PSHE children will be learning to value difference.

Vocabulary we will use: same, different, respect, kind, unkind, rules, safe, fair, qualities, feelings, family.

Literacy

Comprehension: Children will continue to read with an adult in small groups on a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and bring home the books they have been reading on a Wednesday. When reading as a whole class we will be talking about texts and the children will be asked questions about books that we read together. It is a good idea to do this at home with the sharing books we send home each Wednesday.

Word reading: We will continue with our daily phonic lessons. This half term we will learn the following graphemes, in the order as follows: **ff ll ss j v w x y z zz qu words with s /s/ added at the end (hats sits) ch sh th ng nk words ending s /z/ (his) and with s /z/ added at the end (bags)**. We will learn the following tricky words: **as, and, has, his, her, go, no, to into, she, he, of, we, me, be.**

Children will bring home a weekly homework sheet to complete with adults at home.

Writing: Children will be working on segmenting consonant, vowel, consonant words (CVC words). They will be encouraged to develop two - three word sentences to introduce the understanding of words and using 'finger spaces' between each word.

Vocabulary we will use: sentences, words, vocabulary, segment, segmenting fingers.

Maths

This half term children will be working on counting, ordinality and cardinality

Vocabulary we will use: subitise, stopping number, altogether, quantities, pattern, enough, too many, not enough,

Understanding the World

Past and Present: This half term we will be thinking about why we have poppies and remembrance. We will also think about why we celebrate bonfire night. The children will think about why events from the past are still important in the present and future. **Vocabulary we will use:** Last week, yesterday, a long time ago, last year, before I was born.

The Natural World: Children will learn about materials and recycling. We will make a recycling station in our classroom.

Vocabulary we will use: material, wood, plastic, glass, metal, paper, recyclable, hard, soft, rough, smooth, shiny

People Culture and Communities: Children will learn about Christmas and who celebrates this special time.

Vocabulary we will use: Belief, religion, special, special book, celebrate, celebration, different, same.

Expressive Arts and Design

Creating with Materials: This half term we will focus on observational drawings. In painting we will work on how colours can be changed by mixing colours and selecting colours. We will also think about glue and other ways of joining things together. Children will have access to junk modelling and things for joining. **Vocabulary we will use:** light, dark, mix, colour, representation, primary and secondary colours, shape. **Scissor Skills** - we will be working on scissor safety and cutting lines.

Being Imaginative and Expressive: Children have a music and movement lesson with Mr Schofield. This half term they will cover: continuation of beat, rhythm and pitch; experience tempo and dynamics; introduction to basic instruments; nativity performance. **Vocabulary we will use:** Fast and slow, loud and quiet, piano, drums, recorder, guitar, whisper and shout.

Year 1

English

Children will continue to work on applying their phonics to write sentences. They will consolidate understanding of using a capital letter at the start of a sentence and a full stop at the end. Every lesson children will spend time working on letter formation, writing on the line and producing work with a high standard of presentation.

Please see phonic sheets sent home on a Wednesday, they will outline the phonic learning for the next week. It is great if children can spend time looking at this with an adult to give them a preview of what we will be learning.

Reading - children will continue to read in school three times a week. This will include a decoding lesson, a prosody lesson and a comprehension lesson. Children will bring a new book home every **Wednesday**. Children should be able to read their book with a high level of accuracy. This does not mean that the book is 'too easy' it allows them to develop their fluency, prosody and comprehension skills and enjoy reading. Please read daily at home where possible.

Subject Vocabulary: Fiction, non-fiction, capital letter word, sentence, full stop, segmenting fingers, finger spaces. Children will also be exposed to new vocabulary using our class book for inspiration.

Mathematics

We will continue to work on addition and subtraction (within 10) looking at adding numbers together, adding more and building up to addition problems. Moving on to part whole models linking them to subtraction and finding a part. We will then look at geometry looking at 2D and 3D shapes including properties, spotting patterns and sequences of shapes.

Subject Vocabulary: Addition, subtraction, part whole model, adding more, adding together, addition problems, sphere, cone, cuboid, pyramid, cylinder, cube, square, rectangle, triangle, circle and sequences.

Science

This half term in Science the children will learn about the human body.

Subject Vocabulary: senses, sight, touch, smell, taste, hearing, head, neck, arms, elbows, legs, knees, face, ears, eyes, hair, mouth, teeth

Geography

In Geography we will be learning all about our schools surrounding area.

Subject Vocabulary: physical features, human features, aerial photograph, compass, North, South, East, West, village

Art / DT

In Art the topic is 'map it out.'

Subject Vocabulary: abstract, map, felt, gallery, imaginary, shape, texture

Physical Education

Both Robins and Swallows PE sessions are on a Wednesday. This half term we will be doing gymnastics.

Subject Vocabulary: jump, forwards backwards, run, travel gallop.

PSHE

In PSHE we will be learning to value differences.

Subject Vocabulary: same, different, respect, kind, unkind, rules, safe, fair, qualities, feelings, family.

Religious Education

In RE this half term children will be learning about how and why we celebrate special and sacred times?

Subject Vocabulary: Bible, Christians, Joseph, Mary, Jesus, Bethlehem, star, shepherds, wise men.

Music

This half term in Music children will be learning to perform two-pitch songs tunefully.

Subject Vocabulary: pitch, solo

Computing

This half term the children will be learning about digital imagery.

Subject Vocabulary: camera, background, edit, download, drag and drop

Year 2

English

Writing - We will finish covering the grammar expectations for year 2. Sentence types and conjunctions. We will then begin all our grammar when writing simple story recounts. **Reading** - children will continue to read in school three times a week. This will include a decoding lesson, a prosody lesson and a comprehension lesson. Children will bring a new book home every **Wednesday**. Children should be able to read their book with a high level of accuracy. This does not mean that the book is 'too easy' it allows them to develop their fluency, prosody and comprehension skills and enjoy reading. Please read daily at home where possible. **Spellings** - adding er, s or es, ed and ing. Why words end in ch or tch, ck or k.

Subject Vocabulary: capital letter, full stop, question mark, sentence, segmenting fingers, finger space, punctuation

Mathematics

This half term year 2 children will continue working on addition and subtraction and then learn about shape. Children will be adding and subtracting 2 digit numbers and work out how to answer missing number questions. The children will then learn about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes and shape symmetry.

Subject Vocabulary: add, subtract, polygons, triangle, rectangle, pentagon, square, faces, edges, vertices, symmetry, vertical and horizontal.

Science

This half term in Science the children will learn about the human body. Identifying and naming parts of the body, drawing and labelling these. Children will identify our 5 senses and the body part associated with each one.

Subject Vocabulary: senses, sight, touch, smell, taste, hearing, head, neck, arms, elbows, legs, knees, face, ears, eyes, hair, mouth, teeth

Geography

In Geography we will be learning about Our Schools surrounding area.

Subject Vocabulary: physical features, human features, aerial photograph, compass, North, South, East, West, village

Physical Education

Swallows children will have PE on a Wednesday. This half term the focus will be Gymnastics.

Subject Vocabulary: Sequence, roll, travel, zigzag

Art / DT

In Art the topic is 'map it out.'

Subject Vocabulary: abstract, map, felt, gallery, imaginary, shape, texture

PSHE

In PSHE children will be learning to value differences. We will think about what makes us who we are, our special people and how we can make others feel.

Subject Vocabulary: same, different, respect, kind, unkind, rules, safe, fair, qualities, feelings, family.

Religious Education

In RE this half term children will be learning about, How and why do we celebrate special and sacred times?

Subject Vocabulary: Christmas, Jesus, God, Advent, Gospel, angel, sacred

Music

Year 2 will be continuing to increase their rhythmic repertoire, learning to compose simple rhythm patterns and singing in a round. We will learn a new instrument each week.

Subject Vocabulary: beat, pitch, rhythm, round, forte, piano.

Computing

Children will be exploring stop motion. They will create a flip book animation and stop motion animation.

Subject Vocabulary: animation, flip book, frames, decompose, plan, onion skinning

Year 3

English

This half term we will be writing non chronological reports. We will link this back to our work on the Stone Age. Children will learn and use the key features of this text type, including subheadings, factual language, rhetorical questions and paragraphs. It will require the children to recap and use the basics of grammar and punctuation that we covered last half term such as capital letters, full stops, independent clauses, commas, coordinating conjunctions and subordinating conjunctions. We will also be introducing expanded noun phrases, commas in a list, use of the correct tense and adverbs.

We will also be continuing to practice the presentation of our work, thinking about quality over quantity. We will continue to have a weekly spelling rule to practise. This will be added to google classroom every Friday. Children will be expected to apply these spellings in their work too. We will do a spelling test each Friday which will contain some of the words that we have been practising, as well as some words previously taught. Our class book this half term will be The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane.

Subject Vocabulary: full stop, capital letter, comma, question mark, independent clause, coordinating conjunction, subordinating conjunction, adverb, expanded noun phrase, subheading, factual language, rhetorical question, paragraph

Mathematics

We will be following the White Rose Maths Hub scheme of work. We will continue with our addition and subtraction topic before moving onto focusing on multiplication and division. This will involved adding and subtracting 1s, 10s and 100s, adding and subtracting 3 digit numbers using column method, use of the inverse to check answers and estimating answers. Our Multiplication and Division topic will involve using arrays, multiplying and dividing by 2, 5, 10, 4 and 8 as well as knowing these times table facts fluently. We will be practising a new times table each week. Please ensure that your child is accessing Times Tables Rock Stars. It is a really great way to develop quick recall of tables which is so important in year 3!

Subject Vocabulary: exchange, calculations, add, subtract, find the difference, pattern, inverse, estimate, number bond, multiply, times, divide, share, group, array

Science

In Science, we will learn all about nutrition and diet including food groups and comparing animals and human diets. We will then move onto grouping and classifying living things. In this topic we will learn all about vertebrates and invertebrates and classification keys.

Subject Vocabulary: food, nutrition, healthy, protein, carbohydrate, vitamins, minerals, dairy, fats and sugars, fruit and vegetables, classify, sort, group, vertebrate, invertebrate, plants, exoskeleton, flowering and non flowering plants, mammal.

Geography

Our geography topic this half term is Our Local Area- Kildwick. We will carry out fieldwork including using maps and compasses, taking data and making field sketches. We will learn about the human and physical features of Kildwick, the land uses of Kildwick and how the land use links to the physical features.

Subject Vocabulary: settlement, village, function, residential, housing, rural, services, county, map symbol, key, compass, fieldwork, field sketch, land use, physical, human

DT

We will be covering a DT unit where we will design and make a Christmas cushion for an elf. Children will research different cushions and we will come up with a design criteria to follow. Children will then design, make and evaluate their Christmas cushion, learning skills such as sewing, gluing and cutting through this.

Subject Vocabulary: design, design criteria, research, features, colour, sew, stitch, pin, needle, glue gun, decoration, plan, evaluate, advertise

Physical Education

Kingfishers will do PE on Wednesdays in Autumn 2. The children will be doing health related fitness. They will be finding out about stamina and building physical exertion. They will also continue building physical strength and will complete the unit by practising some Yoga poses.

Subject Vocabulary: stretch, Yoga, health, stamina, exertion, physical, fitness, strength, pose

Religious Education

Our topic in RE is 'What is the Trinity?' The children will begin to make suggestions about what texts about baptism and trinity might mean as well as giving examples of what these texts might mean to Christians today.

Subject Vocabulary: baptism, trinity, gospels, grace, holy spirit.

PSHE

Our PSHE topic this half term is "Valuing Differences". In this topic we will look closely at the titles: celebrating differences, who we share our world with, what would I do, is it true? and it could happen to anyone.

Subject Vocabulary: Diversity, Friendship, Respect, Stereotypes, Tolerance, Family, Relationships, education, Adoption, Being yourself, Self-esteem, Citizenship, Community.

Music

The children will be exploring Christmas music. This will involve; singing in call and response, learning Christmas songs and performing in the Christmas concert.

Subject Vocabulary: part singing, call and response.

Spanish

Musical instruments. In this unit, pupils will learn 10 common instruments and will be introduced to the 1st person singular high frequency verb "I play" in Spanish.

Subject Vocabulary: toco, el arpa, el piano, el triangulo, el clarinete, el violin, la trompeta, la guitarra, la bateria, la flauta dulce, los cimbalos

Computing

Kingfishers will be learning to design websites this half term. This will involve using Google Sites to make web pages as part of a collaborative class website, before making their own Google sites website.

Subject Vocabulary: Google Sites, collaborate, content, design, embed, images, insert, tab

Year 4

English

We will be learning about how to structure a non-chronological report through studying some examples of them all about prehistoric creatures to link with our History topic all about the Stone Age last term. We will then create our own report about a creature - pre-historic, mythical or real! Owls will also read and study a book by Neil Gaiman, Hansel and Gretel which we will use as inspiration for our own writing in Spring Term 1. Kingfishers will be reading a book called The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane.

Subject Vocabulary: coordinating conjunctions, subordinating conjunctions, adverbs, adverbials of reason, adverbials of manner, adverbials of time, expanded noun phrases, commas in a list, apostrophes for possession.

Mathematics

We will be following the White Rose Maths Hub scheme of work. We will continue with our area topic before moving onto focusing on multiplication and division. This will involve finding areas of shapes, making shapes with a specific area and comparing areas. Our Multiplication and Division topic will involve using arrays, multiplying and dividing by 3, 6, 9, 7, 11, 12, 1 and 0 as well as knowing these times table facts fluently. We will also learn to multiply 3 numbers together. We will be practising a new times table each week. Please assure that your child is accessing Times Tables Rock Stars. It is a really great way to develop quick recall of tables which is so important in year 3!

Subject Vocabulary: multiply, times, divide, share, group, area, compare

Science

In our science topic for the second part of the autumn term we will continue learning all about nutrition and diet including food groups and comparing animals and human diets. We will then move onto grouping and classifying living things. In this topic we will learn all about vertebrates and invertebrates and classification keys.

Subject Vocabulary: food, nutrition, healthy, protein, carbohydrate, vitamins, minerals, dairy, fats and sugars, fruit and vegetables, classify, sort, group, vertebrate, invertebrate, plants, exoskeleton, flowering and non flowering plants, mammal.

Geography

Our geography topic this half term is Our Local Area - Kildwick. We will carry out fieldwork including using maps and compasses, taking data and making field sketches. Spanish

In Spanish the children will learn about the four seasons of the year along with a key feature for each season in Spanish. The children will be developing skills and knowledge of how to say which is their favourite season and why.

In Kingfishers, the topic is musical instruments. Pupils will learn 10 common instruments and will be introduced to the 1st person singular high frequency verb "I play" in Spanish.

Subject Vocabulary: Las estaciones, el invierno = winter, la primavera = spring, el verano = summer and el otoño = autumn, toco, el arpa, el piano, el triangulo, el clarinete, el violin, la trompeta, la guitarra, la bateria, la flauta dulce, los cimbalos

Physical Education

PE lessons for Owls will happen on Mondays & Fridays. Swimming continues every Monday and we will continue developing our invasion skills through Basketball.

Kingfishers will do PE on Wednesdays in Autumn 2. The children will be doing health related fitness. They will be finding out about stamina and building physical exertion. They will also continue building physical strength and will complete the unit by practising some Yoga poses.

Subject Vocabulary: front crawl, backstroke, float, attack, defend, stretch, Yoga, health, stamina, exertion, physical, fitness, strength, pose

Religious Education

Our topic in RE is 'What is the Trinity?' where the children will begin to make suggestions about what texts about baptism and trinity might mean as well as giving examples of what these texts might mean to Christians today.

Subject Vocabulary: baptism, trinity, gospels, grace, holy spirit.

Computing

Kingfishers will be learning to design websites this half term. This will involve using Google Sites to make web pages as part of a collaborative class website, before making their own Google sites website.

Owls will be looking at Stop motion animation Children will learn how to create simple images and use it to create a small stop motion with changes. They will create a short story idea for their animation and create a story board. Developing these skills to create a smooth animation and add effects.

Subject Vocabulary: Google Sites, collaborate, content, design, embed, images, insert, tab

Year 5

English

Owls will be studying and learning about how to structure a non-chronological report through studying some examples of them all about prehistoric creatures to link with our History topic all about the Stone Age last term. We will then create our own report about a creature - pre-historic, mythical or real! We will also read and study a book by Neil Gaiman, Hansel and Gretel which we will use as inspiration for our own writing in Spring Term 1.

Subject Vocabulary: coordinating conjunctions, subordinating conjunctions, adverbs, adverbials of reason, adverbials of manner, adverbials of time, expanded noun phrases, commas in a list, apostrophes for possession.

Mathematics

Owls in Year 5 will continue learning about multiplication including factors, prime numbers, square numbers, cube numbers as well as multiply and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000 for the first part of the term. We will then move onto fractions and learn about equivalent and improper fractions and how to convert fractions. As well as ordering and then adding and subtracting with fractions. Owls in Year 4 will continue with multiplication and division following by consolidation of areas we have looked at this year.

Subject Vocabulary factors, multiples, common, prime numbers, square numbers, cube numbers, fractions, equivalent, improper, convert, greater than, less than, add, subtract.

Science

Our science topic for the second part of the autumn term will continue learning all about nutrition and diet including food groups and comparing animals and human diets. We will then move onto grouping and classifying living things. In this topic we will learn all about vertebrates and invertebrates and classification keys.

Subject Vocabulary: food, nutrition, healthy, protein, carbohydrate, vitamins, minerals, dairy, fats and sugars, fruit and vegetables, classify, sort, group, vertebrate, invertebrate, plants, exoskeleton, flowering and non flowering plants, mammal.

Geography

Our geography topic this half term is Our Local Area - Kildwick. We will carry out fieldwork including using maps and compasses, taking data and making field sketches. We will learn about the human and physical features of Kildwick, the land uses of Kildwick and how the land use links to the physical features.

Subject Vocabulary: settlement, village, function, residential, housing, rural, services, county, map symbol, key, compass, fieldwork, field sketch, land use, physical, human

DT

This half term the children will learn and apply two new sewing techniques – cross-stitch and appliqué. They will utilise these new skills to design and make a cushion.

Subject Vocabulary: cross-stitch, applique, design, embellish, fabric, running stitch, template, thread.

Physical Education

PE lessons for Owls will happen on Mondays & Tuesdays
Swimming continues on a Monday and we will continue to learn about invasion games and move onto Tag Rugby from a specialist rugby coach on Tuesdays.

Subject Vocabulary: attack, defend, pass, shoot, dribble, front crawl, backstroke, float, breaststroke, dive, jump, survival skills in water.

Computing

Stop motion animation

Children will learn how to create simple images and use it to create a small stop motion with changes. They will create a short story idea for their animation and create a story board. Developing these skills to create a smooth animation and add effects.

Subject Vocabulary: Animation, images, stop motion, storyboard, frames, extending, titles, parts.

Religious Education

Our topic in RE is 'What is the Trinity?' where the children will begin to make suggestions about what texts about baptism and trinity might mean as well as giving examples of what these texts might mean to Christians today.

Subject Vocabulary: baptism, trinity, gospels, grace, holy spirit.

Music

Children will sing Christmas music in a three part round, learn Christmas songs and perform in a Christmas concert.

Subject Vocabulary: part, singing, canon

PSHE

Our PSHE topic this half term is "Valuing Differences". Where we will look at how to celebrate differences and who we share the world with. As well as learning about what is true and what is not.

Subject Vocabulary: Diversity, Friendship, Respect, Stereotypes, Tolerance, Family, Relationships, education, Adoption, Being yourself, Self-esteem, Citizenship, Community.

Spanish

In Spanish the children will learn about the four seasons of the year along with a key feature for each season in Spanish. The children will be developing skills and knowledge of how to say which is their favourite season and why.

Subject Vocabulary: Las estaciones, el invierno = winter, la primavera = spring, el verano = summer and el otoño = autumn

Year 6

English

We'll be starting our second book of the year, 'Oh Maya Gods!' Then studying non-chronological reports, which will finish with a famous outlaws report about Kissin' Kate Barlow. Finally, we will indulge in some Christmas writing and create a Christmas love story.

Subject Vocabulary: subject, object, subordinating clause, parenthesis, verb, noun, fronted adverbial

Mathematics

The first few weeks of this half term is all about fractions. We will be comparing them and also applying the four operations to fractions. We will also be working on converting measures at the end of the term.

Subject Vocabulary: numerator, denominator, simplify, equivalent, metric

Science

An electricity topic will cover: 1 Construct and draw series circuits using symbols. 2 Complete and incomplete circuits. 3 Variations within circuits. 4 Plan - voltage experiment. 5 Investigate - voltage experiment. 6 Evaluate - voltage experiment

Subject Vocabulary: series circuit, cell, bulb, current, voltage, complete/incomplete circuit, switch, buzzer, dependent/independent variables.

Geography

Trade is our topic this half term. We will be thinking about what the UK exports and imports and where to and from. We will find out more about the global economy.

Subject Vocabulary: import, export, economy, supply chain, raw materials, manufactured goods

DT

We will be designing a playground featuring a variety of structures and giving consideration to how the structures will be used.

Subject Vocabulary: prototype, reinforce, apparatus

Physical Education

The PE units this half term are about health related fitness and dance.

Subject Vocabulary: heart rate, fitness, motif

Religious Education

The RE unit this half term is called 'Was Jesus the Messiah?' Children will learn how Christians put their beliefs about Jesus' incarnation into practice in different ways in celebrating Christmas.

Subject Vocabulary: Messiah, Incarnation, Gospel, Prophecy, Saviour, New Testament

PSHE

We will be exploring the ideas of prejudice, stereotypes, bystander behaviour and bullying. We will also celebrate diversity.

Subject Vocabulary: prejudice, stereotype

Music

We will be learning to play the recorder and read musical notation.

Subject Vocabulary: Recorder, fingering, stave, notation.

Spanish

We will be focusing on the days of the week, months of the year and numbers 1-31. This will enable us to say the date and ask and say when our birthday is.

Subject Vocabulary: ¿Cuándo es tu cumpleaños?

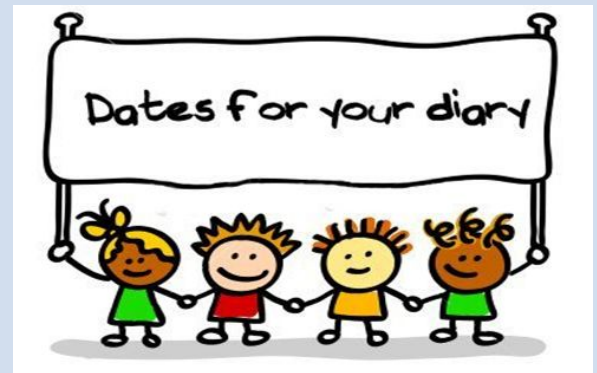
Computing
