
Evidence found at the crime scene included:

Everyone who attended the event thoroughly enjoyed themselves (teachers included) and it is hoped that these experiences will inspire the next generation of scientists.











We are delighted to announce the launch of a new website for 4–7 year olds and accompanying guide for parents and carers.

What's New ?

The website is based on the three-episode Jessie & Friends animated series, which aims to equip 4-7 year olds with the knowledge, skills and confidence they need to stay safer online. It is intended to be used by 4-7 year olds alongside their parents and carers, or within education settings as a learning tool.

The new interactive website encourages 4–7s to engage safely online by helping them to recognise worrying, upsetting or scary situations and reinforcing the key message that they should 'Tell A Grown Up' in these instances. The website is divided into sections for 4–5 and 6–7 year olds and features relevant and ageappropriate games for the chosen age bracket. Each game focuses on one of four topics:

- watching videos
- chatting online
- sharing pictures
- gaming online
