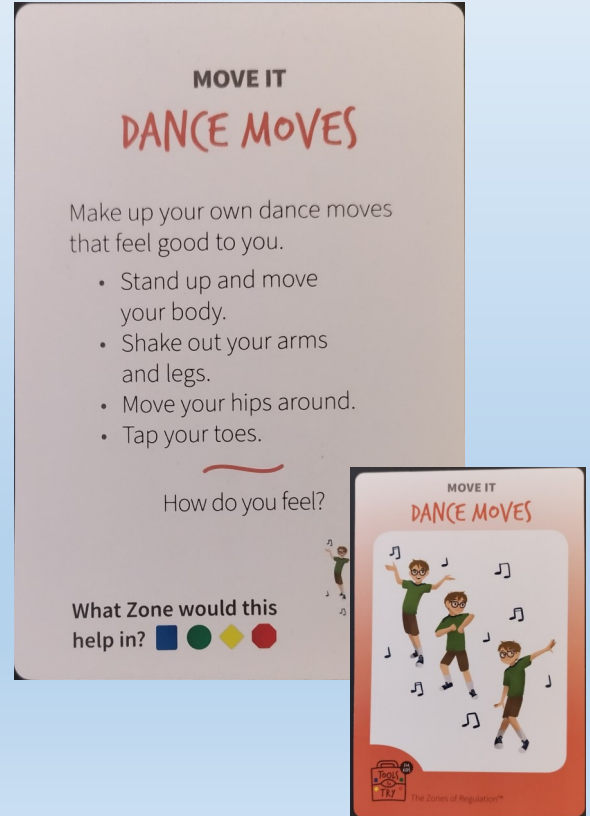

Try another of our 'tools' from Zones of Regulation. Encourage children to use these at home to help develop self regulation skills.

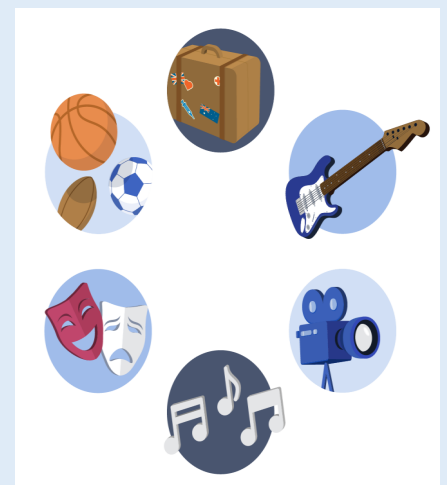

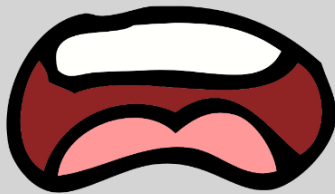

**NEURODIVERSITY**  
refers to a group of people

**NEURODIVERGENT**  
refers to an individual

**MASKING**  
in order to get by in social situations such as school or work, some neurodivergent people will mask their traits to appear neurotypical

**STIMMING**  
a self-soothing activity like leg tapping, playing with fidget toys, or hand flapping

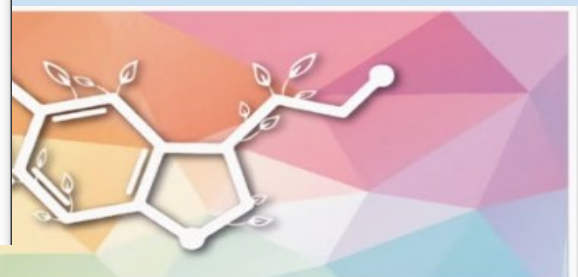

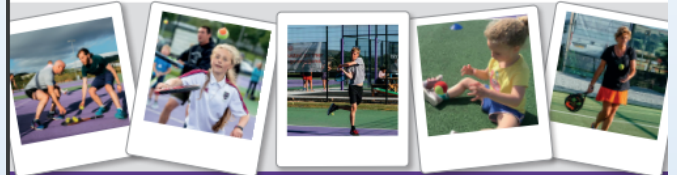

This is a great event for all abilities to get involved in the sport from first timers, to athletes who hope to compete for the region. (The race is part of the Yorkshire Junior Triathlon Series). The day is organised by Leeds and Bradford Triathlon Club.

15-16 years (Youth)	400m swim	3000m run (5 laps)
17-18 years (Junior B)	400m swim	3000m run (5 laps)

Prizes are awarded for the first three male and female in each age group.

All finishers receive a Medal and Goody bag.

No previous experience is required only equipment are trainers and a swimming costume!
