Parking Notice



We are very grateful to the Church and to the White Lion Pub who allow us to use their car parks at drop off and collection times. As per last weeks Newsletter, The White Lion ask that parents and carers do not use the car park for evening events as this is preventing their customers from parking. Further to this we would like to reinforce the email sent to all parents by Mr. Whitehead last Friday evening. We received an email from Reverend Mike who had witnessed aggressive behaviour between parents/carers and cars driving at speed. We ask that all parents and carers are cautious, considerate and show respect when parking. Should this continue the Church will close the car park at drop off and collection times.

To alleviate some of the build up of traffic, we have started to open the side gate onto the playground at 8.40am. This now leaves a 20 minute window for drop offs—please return to your car promptly once you have dropped your child off so that others can park. 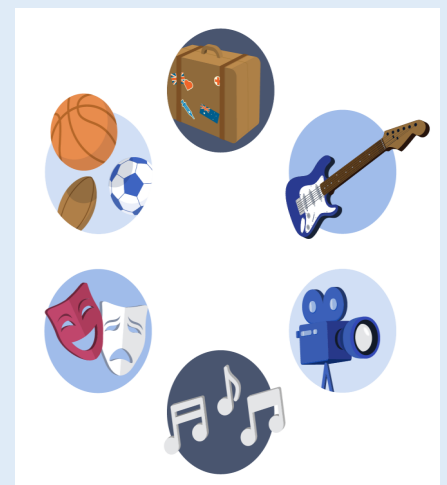

A quick reminder that dogs are not allowed onto the school grounds. We have children in school with severe allergies to dogs. Thank you.



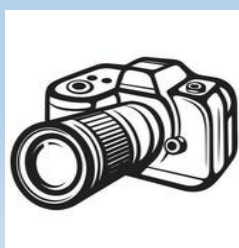
School Photographs

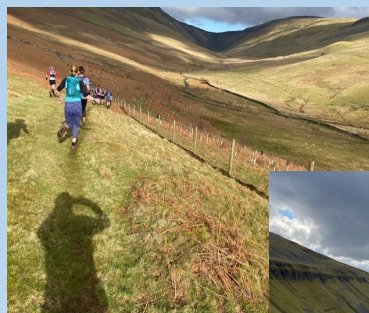
Kildwick Fell Race—Tuesday 21st May

Understanding SEND

It is important that everyone in our school community understands SEND. Please take the time to read this section of the Newsletter each week to understand your child and/or your child's friends.

What is Dyslexia?

Dyslexia is a specific learning difficulty that primarily affects the skills involved in accurate and fluent word reading and spelling.

Dyslexia is not linked to intelligence or poor education, it occurs regardless of gender, age, ability, or ethnicity and in all walks of life.

Dyslexia can present daily barriers in education and many children find it hard to thrive. They may feel shame for their differences which might be misinterpreted as lack of ability, laziness or poor behaviour. This can impact upon their confidence and self esteem.

Early identification and intervention help ensure children maintain their self-esteem.

FACTS

1 in 10 people have **dyslexia**

This means that dyslexia affects 10% of the population.

OVER 1 Million school children in the UK have dyslexia. **Many are undiagnosed.**

49% of all classes have at least one dyslexic child.

3.5X more likely that a child with dyslexia will be temporarily or permanently excluded from school.

AWARE—Family Support



AWARE is a parent-run group supporting families with children and young adults on the autistic spectrum (formal diagnosis not required).

The group covers the Airedale, Wharfedale, Bradford and Craven areas and beyond.

Members include families and supporters in general, as well as health, education and social care professionals.

Early diagnosis of autism can greatly improve the chances of a person receiving appropriate help.

AWARE can support families through the maze of local services which cross health, social care and education boundaries. They can advise on accessing appropriate support from statutory, voluntary and private services, which can make a huge difference to a person with autism, helping them to maximise their skills and achieve their full potential as an adult.

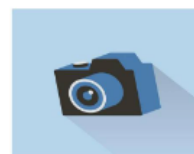

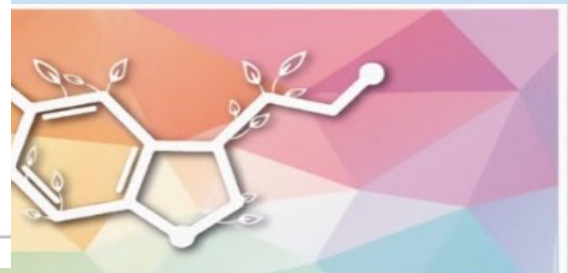

The swim takes place in the Edge, a 25m heated indoor pool and the run is on a closed circuit round the university campus with electronic chip timing. This is a great event for all abilities to get involved in the sport from first timers, to athletes who hope to compete for the region. (The race is part of the Yorkshire Junior Triathlon Series). The day is organised by Leeds and Bradford Triathlon Club.

All finishers receive a Medal and Goody bag.
