Parking Reminder

We are very grateful to the Church and to the White Lion Pub who allow us to use their car parks at drop off and collection times. This helps to keep our children safe on their way to and from school.



Understandably the White Lion ask that parents and carers **do not use the car park for evening events** as this can prevent their customers from parking.

We would also ask that all parents and carers are cautious, considerate and show respect when parking in both the church and the pub car parks. We would hate to lose use of these car parks.

To alleviate some of the build up of traffic, we now open the side gate onto the playground at 8.40am. This now leaves a 20 minute window for drop offs—please return to your car promptly once you have dropped your child off so that others can park. The same applies at home time and we would ask that once children have been collected you return to your car quickly. A reminder that Robins and Swallows can be collected from 3:20pm onwards.

Birthdays



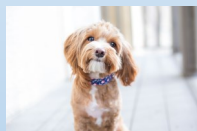

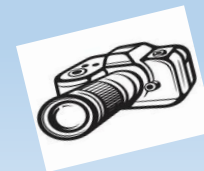
School Photographs

I work with children from across the school in small groups and on a one to one basis supporting learning in class. Children come to work with me in the quiet space of the Intervention Room and benefit from these smaller group interactions which really helps their confidence in class. I also teach Year Two maths on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday mornings. I really believe in helping children to reach their potential, celebrating small steps in progress along the way. In my spare time, I like to stay active playing tennis at Skipton Tennis Club and I enjoy running (I am often found at a Park run on a

Saturday morning). I also keep busy with my two children who are in Year 5 and Year 8 at schools in Skipton.

Quick reminder from the Eco Warriors

Are you interested in recycling pens?

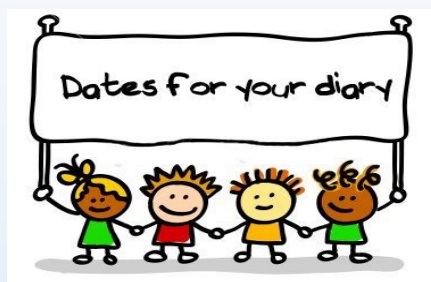

Zones of Regulation Top Tips for Home!

Each week we share a 'tool' from the Zones of Regulation 'toolkit' in this section of the newsletter. These are strategies for children (and adults!) to use to help recognise and manage emotions. Here is an overview for new parents and a recap for existing parents and carers.

The Zones of Regulation is a framework and self-regulation curriculum to teach regulation strategies for managing sensory needs and emotions to children and adults. In our school, children are encouraged to 'check in' in class throughout the day.

Blue Zone: The Blue Zone portrays down feelings and low energy levels such as when someone feels bored, ill or tired.

Green Zone: The Green Zone depicts calmness and the feeling of being in control. A person in the green zone may be described as content, focused, happy or ready for learning. Green is considered as the zone with optimal learning.

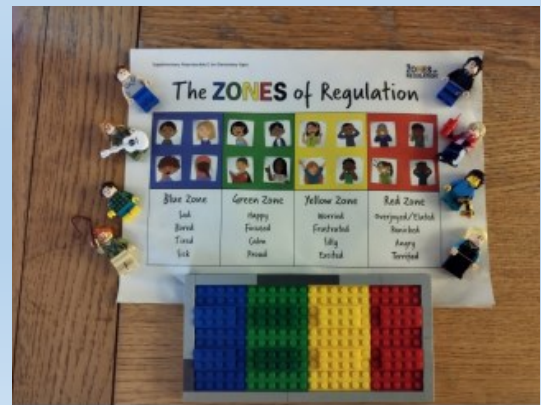
Yellow Zone: The Yellow Zone describes a person with additional levels of energy and elevated emotions, but remains in more control. An individual may be facing nervousness, wiggles, silliness, excitement, anxiety, frustration or stress within the yellow zone.

Red Zone: The Red Zone demonstrates strong emotions and extraordinarily high energy. A person is said to be in the red zone when he is feeling angry, elated, terrified, out of control, devastated or enraged.

Anybody can face problems in self-regulation and emotional control. Using the Zones of Regulation curriculum offers a common language, uniform visual teaching tool, and support for each child in school.

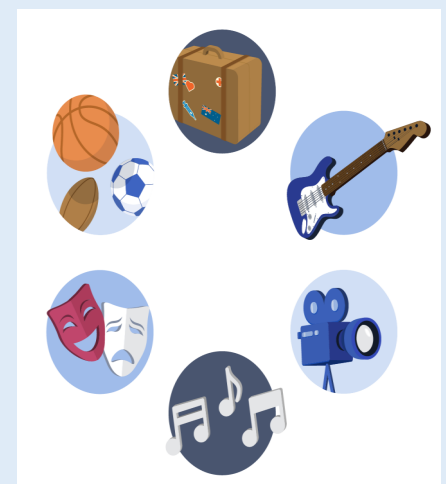
