Class Books

Organisation / Updates:

The Runaway Pea Jack and the Beanstalk Jack and the Incredibly Mean Stalk

PSED is developed through our classroom routines and adult guidance and support in play.

In our PSHE lessons our focus will be all about 'Keeping Ourselves Safe'. Children will talk about how to keep their bodies healthy and safe; Name ways to stay safe around medicines; Know how to stay safe in their home, classroom and outside; Know age-appropriate ways to stay safe online; Name adults in their lives and those in their community who keep them safe.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Communication and Language

We will continue to work on Communication and Language as part of our daily routines. Adults will model language and use opportunities in play to develop vocabulary. We will also ask more questions to check that children understand what has been said. We will concentrate on How and Why guestions this half term. Children will listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding.

Children will be encouraged to retell storys using story language. By using the pictures you post on Google Classroom children will be encouraged to describe events detail.

Children will continue to learn rhymes, songs and poems.

Physical Development

Children are active through their play and our tyres, crates, scooters and lots of other resources are available all the time to children to help physical development and gross motor skills. Their adult guided learning this half term is ball skills. Children will have a PE lesson every Wednesday.

They will work on: Developing confidence, competence, precision and accuracy when engaging in activities that involve a ball. They will further develop and refine a range of ball skills including: throwing, catching, kicking, passing, batting and aiming.

PE – Lessons will be on a Wednesday.

Forest School Session - Friday

Homework: There will be a homework grid on Google Classroom. This is optional. Please post work on to Google Classroom.

Spellings: Reception children do not get spellings. You will be informed of the graphemes and 'tricky' words they are learning so that they can work these at home. See below.

Phonics

This half term children will be learning the following graphemes in this order: Week 1: ai, ee, igh, oa Week 2: oo, **oo**, ar, or *tricky words: was, you, they* Week 3: ur, ow, oi, ear tricky words: my, by, all Week 4: air, er and words with double letters: dd mm tt bb rr gg pp ff tricky words: are, sure, pure Week 5: longer words Week 6: Assessment and consolidation

Literacy

Children will be encouraged to continue to write independently and spontaneously through provision in the classroom. They will have two short adult led writing sessions where they will work on applying their phonic learning. Children will work making up stories with themselves as the main character. Children will be encouraged to record stories in different ways including sentences, words, pictures and mark making.

All children will have three adult led reading sessions a week please see the reading information booklet that has been sent out). It is very important that you reread this book when it is sent home, this will help children to read confidently and fluently.

Mathematics

Maths this half term is 'Alive in Five'. Children will learn about one less, representing zero, the composition of numbers to five (in two and three groups), comparing numbers to five, equal and unequal groups, identify how many there are altogether and how many are hiding. Children will compare mass, learn about full and empty and measuring capacity. They will then move onto measuring ingredients. Please continue to use your Numbots account as much as possible. We are seeing lots of progress in those children using it!

Understanding of the World

This half term children will be learning all about our local history and think about how things have changed. Children will focus on understanding 'the past'. Children will be learning about Chinese New Year which is on Tuesday 1st February.

Expressive Art and Design

Reception children have access to art and design resources at all times and are encouraged to be creative and develop their creations in a way that is meaningful to them. Their adult guided learning this half term will be Art.

Religious Education

Our topic for RE this half term is Our topic for RE this half term is 'Who is a Muslim'. Children will learn to recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways. Year One – What are we learning this half term?

English

Year One will be working on writing sentences with finger spaces, capital letters and full stops.

In Robins Class children will be reading fiction texts including The Runaway Pea, Jack and the Beanstalk and Jack and the Incredibly Mean Stalk.

In Swallows Class children will be reading fiction texts such as Rapunzel and George and the Dragon.

Tricky words for this half term are: *any, many, again, who, whole, where, two, school, call, different, thought, through, friend, work.* All children will have a daily phonic lesson. Some children will have four additional 'Keep Up' phonic sessions each week. I will email and let you know if your child is attending the keep up sessions.

Music

Year One will be together for their Music and Movement session with Mr Schofield on a Thursday afternoon.

Organisation / Updates:

PE – Lessons will be on a Wednesday. Children should come to school in PE kits.
Forest Schools - Sessions will be on a Friday.
Homework: There will be a homework grid on Google Classroom. This is optional but encouraged in Year One.
Please post work on to Google Classroom.
Spellings: Year One will not be given spellings but the phonemes and tricky words they are learning will be put onto Google Classroom so that you can work on these at home. We suggest one or two a week so as not to overload your child's working memory.

History/Geography

This half term will be History. We will focus on local history including a visit to Skipton Castle on Tuesday 18th January. Please ensure that you have paid and/or consented to this trip by Friday 14th January **at the Jatest.**

Science

This half term we will be thinking all about Healthy Living and Children will learn that animals, including humans, have young animals that look like them; that the babies will grow into adults; what humans need to survive (including food and water); what animals need to survive; why it is important to exercise; why it is important to eat the right amounts of food; why it is important to keep clean and

Mathematics

This half term year one children will continue Place Value to 20 (some children will move onto 50). We will start addition and subtraction within 20.

Please continue to use Numbots as much as possible at home to help with your child's key Mathematical skills. We are seeing lots of progress in those children using Numbots regularly.

Computing

Our computing topic this half term will be 'Online Safety'. Children will learn about using the internet safely; online emotions; being kind and considerate and posting and sharing online.

Physical Education

PE this half term will be working on throwing and catching skills. Mrs. Wilkinson will teach PE on a Wednesday.

Art and Design / Design Technology

Our focus this half term will be Art. We will learn about the artists, Paul Klee and Ana Serrano

Year Two

Year Two – What are we learning this half term?

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English

Organisation / Updates:

This half term we will be writing to entertain. The first book we will focus on is Rapunzel by Bethan Woolvin. This story is a twist on the traditional story of Rapunzel. We will compare the similarities and differences between the two stories. Our final piece of writing will be our own sequel to the story.

We will be thinking about using the correct tense in our writing, a wider range of conjunctions and year 2 spelling patterns.

Common exception words we will focus on this half term are; after, last, fast, past, father, pass, grass, class, plant, bath, path and our.

Mathematics

This half term we will begin looking at both 2-D and 3-D shapes. We will name and describe properties of 2-D and 3-D shapes, including number of sides, vertices, edges, faces and lines of symmetry. We will then move onto multiplication and division, making and adding equal groups and arrays. Our final topic this half term will be fractions; we will identify 1/4, 1/4, 1/2, 2/4, 3/ 4, of a number or shape, and know that all parts must be equal parts of the whole.

Science

This half term we will be thinking all about Healthy Living and Children will learn that animals, including humans, have young animals that look like them; that the babies will grow into adults; what humans need to survive (including food and water); what animals need to survive; why it is important to exercise; why it is important to eat the right amounts of food; why it is important to keep clean and wash regularly.

This will include a trip to Skipton castle, please ensure that you have paid and/or consented to this trip by Friday 14th January **at the latest.**

Music

The theme for Music this half term is, How does music help make the world a better place?

PSHE

We will learn that medicines can sometimes make people feel better when they're ill. .

Identify situations in which they would feel safe or unsafe and suggestion ways to deal with unsafe situations, including who we can ask for help.

Learn to recognise a range of feelings associated with loss. Learn and understand the PANTS rule. Identify 'safe' secrets and 'unsafe' secrets

Computing

Digital Imagery - Planning a photo story, taking photos, editing photos, searching images and creating a photo collage. Children will also learn about using the internet safely; online emotions; being kind and considerate and posting and sharing online.

Physical Education

PE this half term will be taught by Mrs Wilkinson. Children will learn w to control a ball when they are rolling and bouncing, throwing and catching, on their own, with a partner and in a group. Children will also think how we can move in different ways negotiating the spaces around them.

Religious Education

In RE this half term we will be thinking about 'Who is a Muslim'.

We will also learn about Ash Wednesday and Shrove Tuesday.

Children will learn to recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways.

Art and Design/ Design Technology

In Art we will be building on our DT skills from last term. Children will be learning about artists Paul Klee and Ana Serrano. We will create castles using 2-D shapes and 3-D models using cardboard/ boxes.

This will include unit and non-unit fractions, equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting fractions, tenths and comparing fractions.

Please ensure that your child is accessing Times Tables Rock Stars. It is a really great way to develop quick recall of tables which is so important in year 3 and year 4!

We will learn written methods to multiply and divide 3 digits by 1 digit. We will then move onto measuring perimeter and area. After that, we will begin to look at fractions. This will include unit and non-unit fractions, equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting fractions, fractions greater than 1 and comparing fractions.

Please ensure that your child is accessing Times Tables Rock Stars. It is a really great way to develop quick recall of times table facts which is so important in year

Year Five – What are we learning this half term?

English

Organisation / Updates:

Our writing will be based around a different book roughly every three weeks. This half term we will be writing to entertain.

Our first class book will be 'The Boy with the Bronze Axe' by Kathleen Fidler. The story explores what happens when a strange boy in strange boat washes up on the shore of the village of Skara Brae. The villagers must decide what to do with him and his strangely sharp axe. We will write additional chapters and alternative plot lines for the main characters Kali and Brockan.

Our second book is called 'The Secrets of Stonehenge' by Manning & Granstrom. We will use the mystical setting of Stonehenge to inspire poetry using a range of poetic devices and figurative language.

In both pieces of writing, we will continue to work on applying spelling and punctuation at a Year 5 level, e.g. relative clauses and modal verbs.

Mathematics

We will be following the White Rose Maths Hub scheme of work. Measurement including length, perimeter, and area will be consolidated and then we will move onto further multiplication and division using formal methods. After that, we will begin to look at fractions. This will include unit and non-unit fractions, equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting fractions, fractions greater than 1 and comparing fractions. Finally, we will covered decimals and percentages.

Children have access to Times Tables Rock Stars in and out of school. It is a really great way to develop quick recall of tables which is so important for making multiplication and division calculations easier. We will be practising times tables daily in school too.

Science

Our topic this half term is **Reversible and Irreversible Changes.** We will learn that irreversible changes can't be undone, however, a reversible change means that the original substance can be retrieved. This means that the original substance may look or feel different but the materials are not new.

PE: Lessons will be on Mondays and Wednesday.

Forest School takes place every Wednesday and may sometimes be a PE lessons. Please bring wellies and waterproofs in case the weather is wet.

Homework: A homework grid of activities will be posted on Google Classroom in the first week of the half term. Pick one activity from this each week to do. Home learning can be posted online or brought into school.
