Message from Mr Whitehead

Dear Parents / Carers

It is wonderful that after two long years, we are edging towards life without Covid restrictions. I would like to express my gratitude for your continued support. You will have seen that the government are now offering guidelines rather than legal requirements and as a result school will still have a Covid risk assessment and outbreak management plan should any instances of infection increase within school.

The government have removed the legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive COVID-19 test. However, they have still advised us that all pupils who test positive should stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least five full days, and then only return to school when they have had two negative test results on consecutive days. I would encourage parents to remain vigilant to the symptoms and continue to use LFTs to limit the potential spread though school. If you have any questions, then please do get in touch.

From next week, the end of the school day for KS2 will return to 3.30pm and for Reception, Y1 and Y2 it will be 3.20pm.

Thank you so much for your response to the email I sent about the invasion of Ukraine by Russia. The hall is filling up with your donations and these will be delivered to The Good Shepherd Centre in Keighley before Friday. It was great for children to come to school wearing blue and yellow to show our solidarity for the people of Ukraine.

Russia's invasion of Ukraine is distressing and concerning for us all. As you know the children's mental well-being is a priority for us in school. We are aware that some of the children will be concerned, anxious or worried about the unfolding situation. Hopefully discussions in class will be informative and reassuring for the children and give them an opportunity to talk and ask questions.

Reception – What are we learning this half term?

Class Books

Organisation / Updates:

This half term our focus books will be Mama Panya's pancake, Jack and the Mean Stalk and Jack and the Beanstalk.

We will also read a story from our classroom daily. A reminder that children bring home recommended reads as sharing books to read at home with you and talk about.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

PSED is developed through our classroom routines and adult guidance and support in play.

In our PSHE lessons our focus will be all about 'Rights and Responsibilities'. Children will cover the following lessons; Looking after my special people; Being helpful at home and caring for our classroom; around and about the school; caring for our world; looking after money. We will also celebrate International Women's Day on Tuesday 8th March.

Communication and Language

We will continue to work on Communication and Language as part of our daily routines. Children will have their music and movement sessions on a Thursday. Our approach with children will be to 'Talk it Through' and we will spend time extending their vocabulary during carpet time and during play. Some children will continue to access the NELI intervention (you will have been made aware if your child is in this group). We have also started a 'Time for Sounds' intervention to support children with their speech. Please continue to add pictures to the Google Stream as children love to talk about their homelife and share with friends. This provides us with great learning opportunities at carpet time.

Physical Development

We work hard to develop fine motor skills through our morning activities and continuous provision in the classroom. Developing gross motor skills supports development of fine motor skills. Children are active through their play and our tyres, crates, scooters and lots of other resources are available all the time to children to help physical development and gross motor skills. Their PE lessons this half term will be circuit training. Children will have a PE lesson every Wednesday.

PE – Lessons will be on a Wednesday.

Forest School Session - Friday (please can wellies be left in school to allow for a change of day where staffing requires)

Phonics

This half term children learn as follows:

Week 1- ai ee igh oa oo ar or ur oo ow oi ear

Week 2 - review er air words with double letters longer words

Week 3 words with two or more digraphs

Week 4 longer words words ending in -ing compound words Week 5 longer words words with s in the middle /z/s words ending –s words with –es at end /z/

We will not learn any new tricky words but children will spend time spelling the words taught so far. Please see Google Classroom for a full list.

Literacy

Children will be encouraged to continue to write independently and spontaneously through provision in the classroom. They will have two short adult led writing sessions where they will work on applying their phonic learning. Children will work making up stories with themselves as the main character. Children will be encouraged to record stories in different ways including sentences, words, pictures and mark making.

All children will have three adult led reading sessions a week please see the reading information booklet that has been sent out). It is very important that you reread this book when it is sent home, this will help children to read confidently and fluently.

Mathematics

In Maths this half term we will complete our work on growing 6,7 and 8 and then move onto building 9 and 10. Children will work on representing these numbers, the composition of these numbers, one more and one less, making pairs and combining groups. We will work on counting backwards from each of these numbers throughout the day and there will be 'remembering red' activities to consolidate previous learning.

Please continue to use your Numbots account as much as possible. We are seeing lots of progress in those children using it!

Understanding of the World

This half term we are thinking all things Safari! We will be learning about Kenya and thinking about how Kenya is different to our country.

Expressive Art and Design

Reception children have access to art and design resources at all times and are encouraged to be creative and develop their creations in a way that is meaningful to them. Their adult guided learning this half term will be DT, making traditional African Jewellery.

Religious Education

This half term our focus books will be Mama Panya's pancake, Jack and the Mean Stalk and Jack and the Beanstalk. In Swallows Class children will also be reading Mama Panya's pancakes and Lila and the secret of rain.

We will also read a story from our classroom daily. A reminder that children bring home recommended reads as sharing books to read at home with you and talk about.

All children will have a daily phonic lesson. Some children will have four additional 'Keep Up' phonic sessions each week. I will email and let you know if your child is attending the keep up sessions.

Music

Year One will be together for their Music and Movement session with Mr Schofield on a Thursday afternoon.

Organisation / Updates:

PE – Lessons will be on a Wednesday. Children should come to school in PE kits.

Forest Schools - Sessions will be on a Friday.

Homework: There will be a homework grid on Google Classroom. This is optional but encouraged in Year One. Please post work on to Google Classroom.

Spellings: Year One will not be given spellings but the phonemes and tricky words they are learning will be put onto Google Classroom so that you can work on these at home. We suggest one or two a week so as not to overload your child's working memory.

History/Geography

This half term Children will be working on the geography of Kenya through focusing on the main human and physical features of the country. Children will learn about the key geographical features of the country including Kenyan wildlife, landscapes and culture. Children will learn about the similarities and differences between Kenya and the UK along with continuing to develop their geographical skills through a variety of fun and interactive activities.

Science

This half term children will learn about plants, children will learn to name the basic parts of a plant, including seeds. They will have the opportunity to plant their own seeds and to make observations of how they grow over time. Children will also learn to identify, name and describe a variety of garden and wild plants as well as evergreen and deciduous trees. Finally the children will use all of their knowledge gained throughout the topic to identify, compare and classify plants.

Mathematics

Children will complete work on place value to 50 and begin work on fractions. Please see Google classroom for a breakdown of work each week.

Please continue to use Numbots as much as possible at home to help with your child's key Mathematical skills. We are seeing lots of progress in those children using Numbots regularly.

Computing

Our computing topic this half term will be 'programming'. Children will learn about; Following instructions, giving simple instructions, debugging and predictions.

Physical Education

PE this half term will be circuit training. Children will work on fitness through a variety of activities, each week will be based on a different skill. Children will measure the progress that they have made and have opportunity to watch others and to evaluate their own performance. This unit has a strong Health and Fitness focus and the children will build on their learning about the effects of exercise on their body in Science last half term.

Ted likes the weather, he also likes statistics and routine but his life is thrown into disarray when his Aunt Gloria and cousin Salim arrive, like a hurricane, to stay in London en-route to a new life in New York. Ted and his older sister Kat arrange to take Salim on the London Eye but although they watch him go up in a pod, he never comes down again. Salim is missing. Ted's analytical mind becomes an asset as he and Kat piece together the information surrounding their cousin's disappearance and begin to unravel the mystery.

In our second unit of work, we will be learning to debate topics. Some will be linked to current affairs and others will be connected to our London topic, e.g. the London centric approach, pros and cons of large cities, building HS2.

In both pieces of writing, we will continue to work on applying spelling and punctuation at a Year 5 level, e.g. relative clauses and modal verbs.

Mathematics

We will continue to follow the White Rose Maths Hub scheme of work. The main focus of the half term will be fractions covering: adding and subtracting fractions, tenths and hundredths, fractions of a set of objects, calculate fractions of a quantity, multiplying fractions by integers, decimal equivalents of tenths/hundredths/thousandths, fraction problem solving and finally percentages. Children have access to Times Tables Rock Stars in and out of school. It is a really great way to develop quick recall of tables which is so important for making multiplication and division calculations easier. We will be practising times tables daily in school too.

Science

Our topic this half term is **Forces and Magnets.** The children will by the end of the unit:

•Know what gravity is and its impact on our lives.

• Identify and know the effect of air resistance.

•Identify and know the effect of water resistance.

• Identify and know the effect of friction.

• Explain how levers, pulleys and gears allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.

Know who Isaac Newton and Galileo were.

PE: Lessons will be on Mondays and Wednesday.

Forest School takes place every Wednesday and may sometimes be a PE lessons. Please bring wellies and waterproofs in case the weather is wet.

Homework: A homework grid of activities will be posted on Google Classroom in the first week of the half term. Pick one activity from this each week to do. Home learning can be posted online or brought into school.

Spellings: Will be posted with the home learning in the Google Classroom. Children will be tested on a Friday.
