



# Kildwick during World War II Key Stage 2

#### History: Curriculum Intent-Key Knowledge

#### **Background**

World War 2 took place from 1939-1945 between the Axis countries and the Allies. In Britain, rationing took place to save resources and children were evacuated from cities to the countryside to keep them safe. Kildwick and Farnhill received some evacuees. Some people from Kildwick and Farnhill went to war and are commemorated on the war memorial.

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	Key dates
1st September 1939	German troops invade Poland.
3rd September 1939	Britain and France declare war on Germany.
10th July 1940	The battle of Britain begins.
7th September 1940	The Blitz begins.
6th June 1944	The D-Day landings.
May 1945	The start of the fundraising for the Kildwick and Farnhill Welcome Home Fund. The committee organised lots of fundraising events to raise money for returning soldiers.
7th May 1945	Germany surrenders to the allies.



### Key Themes and terms which run through our history curriculum

**Army-** an organized military force equipped for fighting on land.

**Conquer**— to gain something by force, often used to describe an army overpowering another country.

**Defeat-** to win a victory over someone.

**Dictator**– a ruler with total power over a country. Often has taken power by force.

**Evacuee**– a person who is sent to the countryside during a war to escape danger.

**Government**— the group of people with the authority to rule the country or state.

Historian- an expert in or student of history

**Invade/Invasion**- an unwelcome intrusion onto occupied land.

**Occupy-** to march aggressively into another country and take over.

**Propaganda**— biased or misleading information used to promote a political cause.

**Prisoner of war-** a person who has been captured and imprisoned by the enemy in war.

**Rationing**— the limiting of the amount of food and produce that people can buy.

**War–** a state of armed conflict between two different groups.
