Governing Body Update – Message from John Perry – Chair of Governors

Minutes of the September 2021 Full Governing Body Meeting were approved - these will be downloaded onto the school website shortly.

The meeting focused around achieving the school vision: Learning to Live, Living to Love, Loving to Learn.

Governors heard an interesting presentation on the approach to learning and emotional well-being interventions from Mrs Manthorp, followed by an opportunity for questions and discussion.

The meeting also heard from Miss Akrigg, Special Educational Needs Coordinator, about the approach to special educational needs and disabilities (SEND), including her recent work with a specialist SEND consultant which has both developed her practice and helped develop school wide approaches to SEND. School is to revisit the SEND Information Report, from the school website, and Inclusion Policy and feedback to governors.

Curriculum updates were provided by Mr Whitehead, including the revised approach to phonics and collaborative work with another local school to develop the History curriculum. Governors were pleased to see that the school was again able to plan for school trips as well as offering a range of extra-curricular activities.

The revised Diocese Collective Worship guidance document was noted.

Governors will with staff, the wider school community and the Church shortly be reviewing the Collective Worship policy.

Governors also acknowledged a September 2021 letter from the Diocese asking all Church of England School governing bodies to reflect on and 'meaningfully review their position on academy conversation'; in essence whether Kildwick Primary should join a multi-academy trust.

Governing Body Update – Message from John Perry – Chair of Governors - Continued

Given the significance of such a decision governors agreed to take a measured approach and carefully consider all available information. Governors are to research the issue further before the December 2021 full governors meeting and consider any next steps at a Spring Term 2022 meeting.

At this stage no decisions have been discussed or made and no changes to the school status will be considered without wide reaching discussion; the Diocese however expects governing bodies to engage with the issue.

The meeting also agreed an approach to 'signing off' a number of key school policies, including on Data protection, e-safety, Exclusion and Looked After Children.

Ben Lazenby was the sole applicant for the vacancy of parent governor circulated in September and therefore has been elected. Governors look forward to Ben joining the governing body and are sure he will bring important qualities to the group.

Following the resignation of Jamie Logan as Parent Governor there is now a further Parent Governor vacancy. School will shortly be organising the nomination and voting process. Please consider applying for this position; the governing body sees the role of parent governor as central to the successful functioning of the school.

Whilst any interested parent can put themselves forward for the position, we would again particularly welcome nominations of parents who would like to develop the Health and Safety brief, an important area of work for the governing body.

The next planned governors meeting is a finance and resource meeting in early November, at school.

There are so many ways you can help -


- Sell raffle tickets

Class 3 Kingfishers and Class 4 Owls visit to local Bronze and Iron Age burial grounds.

Class 3 & 4 walked along the canal and onto Bradley Moor. First, they went to the long barrow, a Neolithic burial site. There they talked about how, when the site was excavated in 1930, burnt and unburnt bones and some flints were found which dated from the Neolithic period. The children discussed the different types of burials from the

Paleolithic, through Mesolithic and Neolithic to Bronze Age and what changed and what stayed the same. Finally, they went to the round cairn Bronze Age burial site and talked about what historians think about Bronze Age burials.



Nell Bank Trip

The Reception children enjoyed their first ever school trip last week. They read the story of 'Tidy' and spent time thinking about how to look after our world. The Nell Bank staff commented on the children's enthusiasm and Miss Akrigg was extremely proud of all the children.


SENDCO
