Pupils at school enjoyed a visit from a Kelsang Dharma, a Buddhist monk. They learnt all about Siddhartha Gautama, the founder of Buddhism, and his life. We also found out that there have been many Buddha's, not just one. They discussed how thoughts can affect feelings and the way that we act and how compassionate we feel. She also told the children about the benefits of meditation and how this can help with thoughts. Then, the children enjoyed doing a breathing meditation- we felt so calm afterwards! 
Kildwick Fell Race
