Dear Parents / Carers,




Staffing

Dear Keighley 10k & 5k participant,

Firstly, from all of us at Sue Ryder Manorlands Hospice, thank you for entering the 2020 Keighley 10k & 5k. Your support is hugely appreciated.

It is with regret that we must now confirm that we are unable to hold the event this year.

However, in order to raise vital funds for Manorlands, we have turned the event into a virtual event. You can complete your 10k or 5k run over the August Bank Holiday weekend ($28^{th} - 31^{st}$ August)

All who take part will receive the new Keighley 10k & 5k medal for 2020. If you look at the <u>webpage</u> it explains how the event will work and there is also a very comprehensive FAQ section.

As someone who has already entered the Keighley 10k & 5k we have automatically transferred your entry to the virtual event and really hope that you will still participate. You do not need to take any action if this is the case and more information will be sent to you in due course.

If you do not wish to take part in the virtual Keighley 10k & 5k there are 3 options.

Option 1 is to donate your entry fee to Sue Ryder Manorlands Hospice. To do this you would not need to take any further action.
