Sticky Knowledge about Famous people

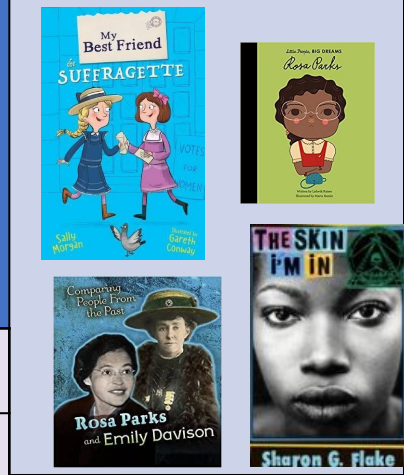
Rosa Parks was a civil rights activist who fought for racial equality the USA. She became very well-known for not giving up her seat to a white person on a bus in 1955AD. She was arrested for this and this started the bus boycott.

There were many racial segregation laws in the USA at this time. These laws prohibited People of Colour from using the same facilities, such as schools, transportation, restrooms, and restaurants, as White citizens. These laws also limited the opportunities for People of Colour to vote, get an education, find employment, and meet other basic needs.

The Suffragettes were a group who fought for the vote for women in Britain in the early 1900s. The Suffragettes used a variety of tactics, many militant, to rally attention and fight for female suffrage. From art, debate and propaganda, to attack on property including window smashing and arson, the Suffragettes gave it their all to for overdue equality.

Emily Davison was a suffragette. In 1913 AD, Emily Davison walked in front of King George V's horse to raise awareness for women's rights. She died from the injuries that she got from this.
