Communication and Language

We will continue to develop communication and language skills through our daily classroom routines and daily activities. We will work on responding skills with a focus on predictions in whole class stories. Children play in the indoor and outdoor provision every day and adults will use this opportunity to model conversations to encourage and develop communication and language skills. Some children have specific Verbo targets; you will have been told if your child is receiving one-to-one/group support in this area of learning.

Physical Development

Gross Motor Skills: Our adult led PE session this half term will be tennis. Children will be taught by a professional tennis coach from Skipton Tennis Centre. **PE will be on a Friday - please send children in PE kits.** We will have opportunity to play outside everyday with resources to develop our gross motor skills.

Vocabulary we will use: pace, balance, sharing and taking turns.

Fine Motor Skills: Children will work on developing their fine motor skills and aim to be writing and forming recognisable letters. Letter formation rhymes are on the Google Classroom for your information. Children have continuous access to resources to enhance and develop fine motor skills and Miss Taylor will lead song drawing lessons throughout the week.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will be learning about growing and changing. We will think about human life stages, reflect back on the life stages the children have been through and think about how to work through big changes in our lives.

Vocabulary we will use: baby, toddler, child, teengaer, adult, old age.

Literacy

Comprehension: Children will continue to read with an adult in small groups on a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and bring home the books they have been reading on a Wednesday. When reading as a whole class, we will be talking about texts and the children will be asked questions about books that we read together. It is a good idea to do this at home with the sharing books we send home each Wednesday.

Word reading: We will continue with our daily phonic lessons in addition to three reading lessons. This half term we will be working on reading longer words and ensuring that the children remember to 'chunk it up' when it comes to reading these longer words. We will revisit our learning from throughout the year to consolidate the children's learning.

Tricky words: We will be reviewing all tricky words and will be working on spelling tricky words.

Writing: They will also complete two English activities weekly when they will work with an adult to compose sentences based on their phonic learning each week. Children will be working on segmenting consonant, vowel, consonant words (CVC words)

Vocabulary we will use: sentences, words, vocabulary, segment, segmenting fingers.

Maths

This half term children will continue to work on numbers to 20 and beyond. We will be thinking about adding more and taking away. Please encourage children to spend time on numbots at home - this has a big impact on early Maths development.

Vocabulary we will use: subitising, more than, less than, whole part, part of, groups, double, add, take away, subtraction.

Understanding the World

Past and Present: We will be thinking back through the children's timeline of their life to help understand past and present. **Vocabulary we will use:** baby, toddler, child, teengaer, adult, old age.

The Natural World: We will be learning about lifecycles and observing the life cycle of a butterfly. We will have our own Butterfly Garden. **Vocabulary we will use:** minibeast, butterfly, caterpillar, chrysalis, egg, leaf, pupa,

People Culture and Communities: This half term we will be learning all about caring for the world and others.

Vocabulary we will use: responsibilities, feelings, friendships, charity.

Expressive Arts and Design

Creating with Materials: Children will be working with paint this half term. **Vocabulary we will use:** paint, painting, colour, inspiration, feeling, emotion, imagination, observation, evaluate, improve, better.

Scissor Skills - children will continue to work on different shapes and materials.

Being Imaginative and Expressive: this half term children will continue to work on continuation of beat, rhythm and pitch; experience tempo and dynamics; introduction to basic instruments **Vocabulary we will use:** Fast and slow, loud and quiet, piano, drums, recorder, guitar, whisper and shout.

Year 1

English

Robins will focus on the instruction writing for making a chocolate mug cake. We will also use Michael Rosen's Chocolate Cake book to support our learning. Swallows focus on the text Grandad's Camper. In addition to our writing around this text, children will also have handwriting lessons and will work on spelling, punctuation and grammar within their writing lessons. Please see phonic sheets sent home on a Wednesday; they will outline the phonic learning for the next week. It is great if children can spend time looking at this with an adult to give them a preview of what we will be learning.

Reading - children will continue to read in school three times a week. This will include a decoding lesson, a prosody lesson and a comprehension lesson. Children will bring a new book home every **Wednesday**. Children should be able to read their book with a high level of accuracy. **This does not mean that the book is 'too easy' - it allows them to develop their fluency, prosody and comprehension skills and enjoy reading.** Please read daily at home where possible.

Subject Vocabulary: fiction, non-fiction, capital letter word, sentence, full stop, segmenting fingers, finger spaces. Children will also be exposed to new vocabulary using our class book for inspiration.

Mathematics

This half term children will start by working on place value of numbers up to 100. We will be using number lines, partitioning, comparing and finding one more and one less than. We will then move onto money learning about different coins and notes. Finally, we will focus on time: days of the week, months of year, telling the time to the hour and half hour.

Subject Vocabulary: partitioning, part-whole model, tens, ones, number lines, one more, one less, greater than, less than, pounds, pence, coins, notes, o'clock, half past, Monday-Friday, January-December, hours, minutes and seconds.

Science

This half term in Science, children will be learning about life cycles. We will learn about the life cycles of humans, different mammals, amphibians and butterflies. We will investigate if there are any patterns between the different life cycles. We will have our own butterfly garden in class.

Subject Vocabulary; Life cycle, offspring, adult, growth, egg, parent, mammal, human, amphibian

Geography

This half term children will be learning all about the world around them with the theme, 'What a wonderful world.'

Subject Vocabulary: compass, North, East, South, West, continent, ocean, mountain, river, equator, North Pole, South Pole

Art

In Art this half term, children will be exploring painting and mixed media.

Subject Vocabulary: primary, secondary, texture, collage, evaluate

Physical Education

PE is on a Friday.

All children will have tennis coaching with a professional tennis coach from Skipton Tennis Centre.

Year One will also have swimming lessons on a Thursday.

Subject Vocabulary: racket, game, ball, net, rally, balance, serve

PSHE

In PSHE, we will be learning about growing and changing. We will think about human life stages, reflect back on the life stages the children have been through and think about how to work through big changes in our lives.

Subject Vocabulary: baby, toddler, child, teengaer, adult, old age.

Religious Education

In RE children will be considering 'what can we learn from sacred books?'

Subject Vocabulary: Christians, Muslims, Jews, Bible, Quran, Torah, Sacred, Special

Music

Year 1 will be continuing to increase their rhythmic repertoire and learning to compose simple rhythm patterns.

Subject Vocabulary: beat, pitch, rhythm, round, forte, piano.

Computing

Year 2

English

Writing - In our final half term this year, we will be pulling together all the grammatical features we have been taught across the year.

Spellings - Tricky words; eye, shoe, thought, through, followed by consolidation. **Homophones;** sun/son whole/hole blue/blew
Spelling patterns / grammar: Why do some longer words have the spelling 'ti' for /sh/? How do I use the possessive apostrophe (singular possession)? When do I swap, drop or double? (-ing, -er, -est, -y, -ed)

Reading - Children will continue with three reading sessions a week. Books will usually be changed on a Wednesday. Please ensure your child has their book in school ready to change.

Subject Vocabulary: capital letter, full stop, question mark, sentence, segmenting fingers, finger space, punctuation, comma, expanded noun phrase

Mathematics

Children will learn about time. They will learn to tell the time, using o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. We will then move onto statistics where they will interpret and draw tallies and graphs. Our final topic is position and direction where children will learn to describe turns and movements.

Subject Vocabulary: O'clock, half past, quarter to, quarter past, pictogram, tally, bar chart, left, right, whole, half, quarter

Science

This half term in Science, children will be learning about life cycles. We will learn about the life cycles of humans, different mammals, amphibians and butterflies. We will investigate if there are any patterns between the different life cycles.

Subject Vocabulary: Life cycle, offspring, adult, growth, egg, parent, mammal, human, amphibian

Geography

This half term children will be exploring 'What a wonderful world.'

Subject Vocabulary: compass, north, east, south, west, continent, ocean, mountain, river, equator, North Pole, South Pole

Physical Education

PE is a **Friday**. We will continue with tennis lessons from Skipton Tennis Centre.

Subject Vocabulary: racket, game, ball, net, rally, balance, serve

Art

In Art this half term, children will be exploring painting and mixed media.

Subject Vocabulary: primary, secondary, texture, collage, evaluate

PSHE

In PSHE we will be learning about growing and changing. We will learn about the human life cycle, where do babies come from, who can help and dealing with change, eg someone moving away.

Subject Vocabulary: baby, toddler, child, teenager, adult, old age, womb, sperm, egg, trusted

Religious Education

In RE children will be considering 'what can we learn from sacred books?'

Subject Vocabulary: Christians, Muslims, Jews, Bible, Quran, Torah, Sacred, Special

Music

Year 2 will be continuing to increase their rhythmic repertoire, learning to compose simple rhythm patterns and singing in a round. We will learn a new instrument each week.

Subject Vocabulary: beat, pitch, rhythm, round, forte, piano.

Computing

This half term we will be programming using Scratch junior 2.

Subject Vocabulary: animation, loop, algorithm, precise, computer code, debug, code, sequence

Year 3

English

In English, we will be creating a holiday brochure. We will first look at the area of Sicily before moving onto making an independent brochure for Italy. We will look at the features of persuasive brochures while continuing to work on our year group grammar. We will continue to focus on extending sentences using coordinating and subordinating conjunctions, adding extra detail about when, where or how something happened using adverbs, using adjectives to create expanded noun phrases and using prepositions to describe where objects are compared to other objects.

Subject Vocabulary: non-fiction, word family, standard English, verb, noun, adjective, conjunction, expanded noun phrase, preposition, adverb, apostrophe, simile, metaphor, rhetorical question, alliteration, subheading, slogan, exaggeration, present tense

Mathematics

We will be following the White Rose Maths Hub scheme of work. We will be starting a topic on shape, which will include looking at turns and angles, learning to measure and compare these. We will then learn how to recognise 2D and 3D shapes, identify horizontal and vertical, parallel and perpendicular lines, as well as drawing polygons and making 3D shapes. We will finally move onto statistics, learning how to draw and interpret bar charts and pictograms and collect and represent our own data.

Subject Vocabulary: bar chart, pictogram, polygon, 2D, 3D, right angle, acute, obtuse, clockwise, anticlockwise, horizontal, vertical, parallel, perpendicular

Science

Our topic this half term is plants. In this topic, we will be covering the following lesson sequence: 1. Parts of a plant 2. Plant dissection 3. Plant growth 4. The stem and water transportation 5. Kingfishers will explore the topic of data handling. In this topic they will learn the key skills of using logical thinking to explore more complex software; predicting, testing and explaining what it does. Learning about the pros and cons of digital versus paper databases. Sorting and filtering databases to easily retrieve information. Creating and interpreting charts and graphs to understand data.

Subject Vocabulary: field, record, data.

Year 4

English

In English, we will be creating a holiday brochure. We will first look at the area of Sicily before moving onto making an independent brochure for Italy. We will look at the features of persuasive brochures while continuing to work on our year group grammar. We will continue to focus on extending sentences using coordinating and subordinating conjunctions, adding extra detail about when, where or how something happened using adverbs and fronted adverbials and using prepositional phrases to further expand noun phrases.

Subject Vocabulary: non-fiction, word family, diary, standard English, verb, noun, adjective, clause, synonym, conjunction, fronted adverbial, expanded noun phrase, preposition/prepositional phrase, adverb/adverbial, apostrophe, simile, metaphor, rhetorical question, alliteration, subheading, slogan, exaggeration.

Mathematics

Year 4 will start the half term looking at money: writing, converting, estimating and calculating problems with money. They will then move onto time focusing on units of time and converting between 12 & 24 hour clock. The next shape unit introduces angles, different shapes and symmetry. Statistics follows with charts and line graphs. Finally position & direction will teach pupils about coordinates and translations.

Subject Vocabulary: pounds, pence, add, subtract, multiply, divide, change, estimate, convert, years, months, weeks, days, analogue, digital, hours, minutes, seconds, angles, triangles, quadrilaterals, polygons, symmetry, chart, line graphs, coordinates & translations

Mathematics

We will continue our unit of work is about position & direction. Year 5 pupils will read and plot coordinates and deal with translations & reflections. Next comes addition, subtraction, multiplications and division of decimals; followed by negative numbers. Children will then learn to convert units, including length, mass and time. The final unit covers measuring volume and estimating capacity.

We will be applying our working scientifically skills to take part in experiments and investigations.

Subject Vocabulary: sources, scale, monitor, investigation.

Geography

We will be learning about China. We will be finding out about the human impact on China's physical geography, China's economic growth and the most popular tourist attractions in the country.

Subject Vocabulary: physical geography, human geography, economic growth, landmark, culture.

Art

Our art unit this half term is called 'Making Memories' which teaches children to create expressive sculptures and reflect on their artistic decisions.

Subject Vocabulary: sculpture, imagery, 3D.

Physical Education

We will be improving our athletics skills. We will also take part in outdoor adventurous activities on our residential at Beverley Park.

Subject Vocabulary: teamwork, direction.

Religious Education

The theme this half term is 'What kind of king is Jesus?'. The children will consider connections between biblical texts and the Kingdom of God.

Subject Vocabulary: Kingdom, Holy Spirit, parables, impact, allegory, symbols, courageous advocates.

PSHE

The topic this half term is 'Growing and Changing'. We will be looking at a range of topics including online pressures, preparation for secondary school and puberty.

Subject Vocabulary: puberty, physical, emotional.

Music

We will be perfecting our end of year songs and singing in groups and as soloists.

Subject Vocabulary: rhythm, pitch, volume

Spanish

Our Spanish this half term is about 'Me in the World'. We will learn about how to talk about festivals around the world.

Subject Vocabulary: Mi fiesta preferida es...

Computing

Big Data 2: To know that data can become corrupted within a network but this is less likely to happen if it is sent in packets.

Subject Vocabulary: Big Data, Bluetooth, corrupt data, infrared waves, QR code
