



Skills development

Learn how to use a tablet for photos/ aided.

Experiment printing with different objects- paint on sponge.

Artist Knowledge

<u>Yayoi Kasama</u> ... was interested in polka dots. She painted them on paper to begin with using different kinds of paints. Then, she began to paint them on walls, floors, household objects and even her assistant! <u>Yayoi called</u>

these series of polka dots 'infinity nets'.







<u>Wassily Kandinsky</u> was born in Russia in 1866. When he grew up, he worked as a university teacher, but it didn't make him happy.

When he was 30, he left his job and went to art school. He found art school easy and excelled at his studies. Kandinsky thought a lot about colors and how they make people feel. He believed that colors had a soul.

Sketch Book opportunities (Annotated with comments)

Drawing repeating shapes and patterns.

Sketching samples from Kandinsky pictures- eg

Shading or decorating circles.

Drawing around templates to practise.

Overlap/ change pattern in overlap.
