Our Wonderful World



Vocabulary

colour	Light as our eyes see it
primary	Red yellow blue
secondary	Colours made from primary colours
Shapes	Circles squares triangles
print	Make a mark on a surface, a painted shape pressed onto a surface.
pattern	Shapes arranged or repeating
decorate	Draw or embellish to a design
overlap	Place shapes that cover each other in places
Computer art	Pictures drawn or edited on a computer
photograph	Use a tablet to capture an image
zoom	Function to study close up on a screen

Essential Knowledge KS1

Simple art program

- select simple tools
- Lines: know how to alter the thickness of a line
- Shape: know how to use shape and fill tools
- Eraser: know how to use to alter the image
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Freeform pattern:

- roll printing inks over found objects e.g. mesh, stencils
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Marbling technique

Colour can be used to create a specific background

- e.g. black ink for a night sky and add silhouettes

Repetitive patterns

- use simple printing blocks along lines

Skills development

Learn how to use a tablet for photos/ aided.

Practise making shapes of different sizes on drawing programme and use zoom with help.

Arrange pre-cut shapes into patterns and pictures.

Practise drawing/ with without templates- cutting out and arranging into patterns and pictures.

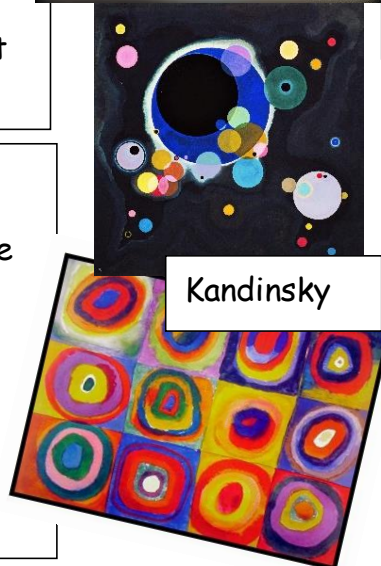
Experiment printing with different objects- paint on sponge.

Finished Pieces

Place shapes and then photograph- class/ big scale group or individual.

Make a shape picture on the computer.

Print with pre-cut circle shapes- potato/ plasticene- to make a picture or decorate a 3D space (see infinity room boxes.)



Artist Knowledge

Yayoi Kasama ... was interested in polka dots. She painted them on paper to begin with using different kinds of paints. Then, she began to paint them on walls, floors, household objects and even her assistant! Yayoi called these series of polka dots 'infinity nets'.



Wassily Kandinsky was born in Russia in 1866. When he grew up, he worked as a university teacher, but it didn't make him happy.

When he was 30, he left his job and went to art school. He found art school easy and excelled at his studies. Kandinsky thought a lot about colors and how they make people feel. He believed that colors had a soul.
